1-7 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-8 AN ACT

1-9 relating to the authority of certain counties to impose a county
1-10 hotel occupancy tax.

1-11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-12 SECTION 1. Section 352.002, Tax Code, is amended by adding
1-13 Subsection (f) to read as follows:

1-14 (f) The commissioners court of a county that has a
1-15 population of 150,000 or more and that is bordered by the Brazos and
1-16 Navasota Rivers may impose a tax as provided by Subsection (a).
1-17 This subsection expires September 1, 2015.

1-18 SECTION 2. Section 352.003, Tax Code, is amended by adding
1-19 Subsection (h) to read as follows:

1-20 (h) The tax rate in a county authorized to impose the tax
1-21 under Section 352.002(f) may not exceed two percent of the price
1-22 paid for a room in a hotel. This subsection expires September 1,
1-23 2015.

1-24 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 352, Tax Code, is amended
1-25 by adding Section 352.1034 to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 352.1034. USE OF REVENUE AND RELATED ISSUES:
1-27 MID-SIZED COUNTY BORDERING BRAZOS AND NAVASOTA RIVERS. (a) This
1-28 section applies only to a county authorized to impose a tax by
1-29 Section 352.002(f).

1-30 (b) The county must spend at least 45 percent of the revenue
1-31 from the tax on marketing projects that directly promote tourism,
1-32 hotel, and convention activity.

1-33 (c) The county shall produce an annual report indicating the
1-34 tourism, hotel, and convention activity attributable to events held
1-35 at facilities that receive money from the tax.

1-36 (d) The county shall create an advisory committee to oversee
1-37 spending of the tax. The committee must include at least two
1-38 representatives from the hotel industry.

1-39 (e) This section expires September 1, 2015.

1-40 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-41 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-42 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-43 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-44 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
