## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the requirements of a municipal or county budget that

3 raises more property taxes than in the previous year's budget.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 102.005, Local Government Code, is

amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to

7 read as follows:

- 8 (b) A proposed budget that will require raising more revenue
- 9 from property taxes than in the previous year must contain a cover
- 10 page with the following statement in 18-point or larger type: "This
- 11 budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget
- 12 by (insert total dollar amount of increase and percentage
- 13 increase), and of that amount (insert amount computed by
- 14 multiplying the proposed tax rate by the value of new property added
- to the roll) is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to
- 16 the tax roll this year."
- 17 (c) The proposed budget shall be available for inspection by
- 18 any person [taxpayer]. If the municipality maintains an Internet
- 19 website, the municipal clerk shall take action to ensure that the
- 20 proposed budget is posted on the website.
- 21 SECTION 2. Sections 102.006(a) and (c), Local Government
- 22 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) The governing body of a municipality shall hold a public
- 24 hearing on the proposed budget. Any person [taxpayer of the

- 1 municipality] may attend and may participate in the hearing.
- 2 (c) The governing body shall provide for public notice of
- 3 the date, time, and location of the hearing. The notice must
- 4 include, in type of a size at least equal to the type used for other
- 5 items in the notice, any statement required to be included in the
- 6 proposed budget under Section 102.005(b).
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 102.0065, Local Government Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 9 <u>(d) Notice under this section must include, in type of a</u>
- 10 size at least equal to the type used for other items in the notice,
- any statement required to be included in the proposed budget under
- 12 Section 102.005(b).
- 13 SECTION 4. Section 102.007, Local Government Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 15 <u>(c) Adoption of a budget that will require raising more</u>
- 16 revenue from property taxes than in the previous year requires a
- 17 separate vote of the governing body to ratify the property tax
- increase reflected in the budget. A vote under this subsection is
- in addition to and separate from the vote to adopt the budget or a
- 20 vote to set the tax rate required by Chapter 26, Tax Code, or other
- 21 <u>law.</u>
- 22 SECTION 5. Section 102.008, Local Government Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 102.008. APPROVED BUDGET FILED WITH MUNICIPAL CLERK:
- 25 POSTING ON INTERNET. On final approval of the budget by the
- 26 governing body of the municipality, the governing body shall:
- 27 (1) file the budget with the municipal clerk; and

- 1 (2) if the municipality maintains an Internet website,
- 2 take action to ensure that a copy of the budget is posted on the
- 3 website.
- 4 SECTION 6. Section 102.011, Local Government Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 102.011. CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH CHARTER PROVISIONS
- 7 CONTROL. If a municipality has already adopted charter provisions
- 8 that require the preparation of an annual budget covering all
- 9 municipal expenditures and if the municipality conducts a public
- 10 hearing on the budget as provided by Section 102.006 and otherwise
- 11 complies with the provisions of this chapter relating to property
- 12 tax increases, the charter provisions control. After the budget
- 13 has been finally prepared and approved, a copy of the budget and the
- 14 amendments to the budget shall be filed with the county clerk, as
- 15 required for other budgets under this chapter.
- 16 SECTION 7. Section 111.003, Local Government Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 111.003. ANNUAL BUDGET REQUIRED. (a) During the 7th
- 19 or the 10th month of the fiscal year, as determined by the
- 20 commissioners court, the county judge, assisted by the county
- 21 auditor or county clerk, shall prepare a budget to cover all
- 22 proposed expenditures of the county government for the succeeding
- 23 fiscal year.
- 24 (b) A proposed budget that will require raising more revenue
- 25 from property taxes than in the previous year must contain a cover
- 26 page with the following statement in 18-point or larger type: "This
- 27 budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget

- 1 by (insert total dollar amount of increase and percentage
- 2 increase), and of that amount (insert amount computed by
- 3 multiplying the proposed tax rate by the value of new property added
- 4 to the roll) is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to
- 5 the tax roll this year."
- 6 SECTION 8. Section 111.006(b), Local Government Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) The copy of the proposed budget shall be available for
- 9 inspection by any person [taxpayer]. If the county maintains an
- 10 Internet website, the county clerk shall take action to ensure that
- 11 the proposed budget is posted on the website.
- 12 SECTION 9. Sections 111.007(a) and (c), Local Government
- 13 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The commissioners court shall hold a public hearing on
- 15 the proposed budget. Any <u>person</u> [taxpayer of the county] may attend
- 16 and may participate in the hearing.
- 17 (c) The commissioners court shall give public notice that it
- 18 will consider the proposed budget on the date of the hearing. The
- 19 notice must state the date, time, and location of the hearing. The
- 20 notice must include, in type of a size at least equal to the type
- 21 <u>used for other items in the notice, any statement required to be</u>
- included in the proposed budget under Section 111.003(b).
- SECTION 10. Section 111.0075, Local Government Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 25 (d) Notice under this section must include, in type of a
- 26 size at least equal to the type used for other items in the notice,
- 27 any statement required to be included in the proposed budget under

- 1 <u>Section 111.003(b).</u>
- 2 SECTION 11. Section 111.008, Local Government Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 4 (c) Adoption of a budget that will require raising more
- 5 revenue from property taxes than in the previous year requires a
- 6 separate vote of the commissioners court to ratify the property tax
- 7 increase reflected in the budget. A vote under this subsection is
- 8 in addition to and separate from the vote to adopt the budget or a
- 9 vote to set the tax rate required by Chapter 26, Tax Code, or other
- 10 <u>law.</u>
- 11 SECTION 12. Section 111.009, Local Government Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 111.009. APPROVED BUDGET FILED WITH COUNTY CLERK:
- 14 POSTING ON INTERNET. On final approval of the budget by the
- 15 commissioners court, the court shall:
- 16 (1) file the budget with the county clerk; and
- 17 (2) if the county maintains an Internet website, take
- action to ensure that a copy of the budget is posted on the website.
- 19 SECTION 13. Section 111.033, Local Government Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 111.033. ANNUAL BUDGET REQUIRED. (a) On or
- 22 immediately after the first day of each fiscal year, the county
- 23 auditor shall prepare a budget to cover the proposed expenditures
- of the county government for that fiscal year.
- 25 (b) A proposed budget that will require raising more revenue
- 26 from property taxes than in the previous year must contain a cover
- 27 page with the following statement in 18-point or larger type: "This

- 1 budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget
- 2 by (insert total dollar amount of increase and percentage
- 3 increase), and of that amount (insert amount computed by
- 4 multiplying the proposed tax rate by the value of new property added
- 5 to the roll) is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to
- 6 the tax roll this year."
- 7 SECTION 14. Section 111.037(b), Local Government Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (b) The copy of the proposed budget shall be available for
- 10 public inspection by any <u>person</u> [taxpayer]. If the county
- 11 maintains an Internet website, the county clerk shall take action
- 12 to ensure that the proposed budget is posted on the website.
- SECTION 15. Section 111.038, Local Government Code, is
- 14 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) The commissioners court shall hold a public hearing on
- 17 the proposed budget. Any person [taxpayer of the county] may attend
- 18 and may participate in the hearing.
- 19 (d) Notice under this section must include, in type of a
- 20 size at least equal to the type used for other items in the notice,
- 21 any statement required to be included in the proposed budget under
- 22 Section 111.033(b).
- 23 SECTION 16. Section 111.0385, Local Government Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 25 (d) Notice under this section must include, in type of a
- 26 size at least equal to the type used for other items in the notice,
- 27 any statement required to be included in the proposed budget under

- 1 <u>Section 111.033(b).</u>
- 2 SECTION 17. Section 111.039, Local Government Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 4 (c) Adoption of a budget that will require raising more
- 5 revenue from property taxes than in the previous year requires a
- 6 separate vote of the commissioners court to ratify the property tax
- 7 increase reflected in the budget. A vote under this subsection is
- 8 in addition to and separate from the vote to adopt the budget or a
- 9 vote to set the tax rate required by Chapter 26, Tax Code, or other
- 10 <u>law.</u>
- 11 SECTION 18. Section 111.040, Local Government Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 111.040. APPROVED BUDGET FILED WITH OFFICERS: POSTING
- 14 ON INTERNET. On final approval of the budget by the commissioners
- 15 court, the court shall:
- 16 (1) file a copy of the budget with the county auditor
- 17 and the county clerk; and
- 18 (2) if the county maintains an Internet website, take
- 19 action to ensure that a copy of the budget is posted on the website.
- 20 SECTION 19. Section 111.067, Local Government Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 22 (d) Notice under this section must include, in type of a
- 23 size at least equal to the type used for other items in the notice,
- 24 any statement required to be included in the proposed budget under
- 25 Section 111.033(b).
- SECTION 20. This Act applies only to a budget adopted on or
- 27 after the effective date of this Act.

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1 SECTION 21. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
