1 AN ACT

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

2 (g) A release or extension preserves a secondary obligor's  
3 recourse if the terms of the release or extension provide that:

4 (1) the person entitled to enforce the instrument  
5 retains the right to enforce the instrument against the secondary  
6 obligor; and

7 (2) the [~~the~~] recourse of the secondary obligor  
8 continues as if [~~though~~] the release or extension had not been  
9 granted.

10 SECTION 4. Section 3.104(k), Business & Commerce Code, is  
11 repealed.

12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
