A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to retirement benefits for retired Texas Rangers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 814.107, Government Code, is amended by 4 5 amending Subsections (b) and (f) and adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), and (b-3) to read as follows: 6 (b) The standard service retirement annuity payable for at 7 least 20 years of service credit as a law enforcement or custodial 8 officer is an amount computed on the basis of the member's average 9 monthly compensation for the 36 highest months of compensation in 10 11 the employee class or the amount specified by Subsections (b-1) 12 through (b-3), if applicable, times the sum of the percentage 13 factor used in the computation of a standard service retirement 14 annuity under Section 814.105 plus .5 percent. (b-1) Subject to Subsection (b-2), a law enforcement or 15 custodial officer may elect to have the person's standard service 16 retirement annuity computed under Subsection (b) based on the 17 18 monthly compensation that is in effect for: (1) the position or employee classification that was 19 held by the person at the time the person retired; or 20 21 (2) the position or employee classification in effect 22 that is most similar to that described by Subdivision (1). 23 (b-2) A person is eligible for a standard service retirement annuity computed as provided by Subsection (b-1) if the person: 24

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1	(1) was employed by the Department of Public Safety
2	and commissioned as a Texas Ranger;
3	(2) honorably retires after at least eight years of
4	creditable service as a Texas Ranger or as a director of the
5	Department of Public Safety;
6	(3) has at least two years of creditable service in the
7	commissioned position or employee classification described by
8	Subsection (b-1)(1); and
9	(4) makes a request to the retirement system for
10	computation of the person's average monthly compensation under
11	Subsection (b-1).
12	(b-3) If the monthly compensation for a position or employee
13	classification described by Subsection (b-1)(1) or (2) is stated as
14	a range, the amount used to compute the standard service retirement
15	annuity under Subsection (b-1) is the average monthly compensation
16	paid to all persons holding the position or employee
17	classification.
18	(f) The standard combined service retirement annuity
19	payable for at least 20 years of service credit as a law enforcement
20	or custodial officer may not exceed 100 percent of the average
21	compensation computed under Subsection (b) or Subsections (b-1)
22	through (b-3), as applicable.

23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
