A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a kindergarten-plus pilot project for certain children.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	Article I. Definitions.
5	(1) The "commissioner" means the Texas Education
6	Commissioner.
7	(2) The "agency" means the Texas Education Agency.
8	(3) "Economically disadvantaged" means:
9	(A) Students from a family with an annual income
10	at or below the official poverty line; or,
11	(B) Students eligible for Temporary Assistance
12	for Needy Families or other public assistance; or,
13	(C) Students who received a Pell Grant or
14	comparable state program of need-based financial assistance; or,
15	(D) Students eligible for programs assisted
16	under Title II of the Job Training Partnership Act; or,
17	(E) Students eligible for Benefits under the Food
18	Stamp Act of 1977.
19	Article II. Kindergarten-Plus Program Pilot Project.
20	Subchapter E, Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding

(1) Establish a three-year study that extends

SECTION 1. Duties of the Commissioner of Education.

(a) The commissioner shall:

Section 29.162 to read as follows:

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- 1 approved full-day kindergarten programs by 40 instructional days
- 2 for certain students in eligible school districts;
- 3 (2) Award grants to eligible school districts
- 4 from funds appropriated for the purpose;
- 5 (3) Adopt rules necessary to administer this
- 6 section, including campus application requirements, procedures for
- 7 evaluating applications for grants;
- 8 (4) Provide standards and a curriculum for the
- 9 Kindergarten-Plus program;
- 10 (5) Establish district reporting and evaluation
- 11 requirements.
- 12 SECTION II. Eligible Districts.
- 13 (a) This act applies to districts which reported to
- the agency more than 56,000 students enrolled in 2005-2006, and,
- 15 (b) Who reported more than 81 percent of the student
- 16 population as economically disadvantaged or eligible for free or
- 17 reduced lunch in 2005-2006.
- 18 (c) A district may use funds received under this
- 19 subsection only for the purpose of the district's Kindergarten-Plus
- 20 program.
- 21 (d) A school district Kindergarten-Plus program must,
- 22 at a minimum, consist of:
- 23 (1) twenty additional instruction days for an
- 24 eligible child during the summer before the child will begin
- 25 kindergarten; and,
- 26 (2) twenty additional instruction days for an
- 27 eligible child during the summer after the child completes

- 1 kindergarten.
- 2 (3) a curriculum based on improving numeracy,
- 3 literacy and social skills in students.
- 4 (e) A school district receiving funds under this
- 5 section shall:
- 6 (1) Demonstrate that its Kindergarten-Plus
- 7 program will meet all state standards and employ only qualified
- 8 teachers and other staff.
- 9 (2) Compensate teachers at the same rate and
- 10 under the same terms for Kindergarten-Plus as teachers are paid for
- 11 regular full-day kindergarten programs.
- 12 (3) A teacher who teaches a Kindergarten-Plus
- 13 program is entitled to two additional professional development days
- 14 each school year.
- 15 (4) Employ a sufficient number of teachers as
- 16 provided by Section 25.112 of this section.
- 17 (5) Notify the population in the district whose
- 18 children are eligible for enrollment in Kindergarten-Plus of the
- 19 availability of the class. The system must include public notices
- 20 issued in English and Spanish.
- 21 SECTION III. Student eligibility.
- 22 (a) A child is eligible to participate in a school
- 23 district's Kindergarten-Plus program if the:
- 24 (1) Child's parent or guardian has applied for
- 25 the child to participate in the kindergarten-plus program in the
- 26 time and manner required by the district and the district has
- 27 accepted the child's application;

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- 1 (2) Child qualified for a pre-kindergarten
- 2 program under Section 29.153 of this section prior to reaching
- 3 school eligibility under Section 25.001 of this section; or,
- 4 (3) Child is entitled to attend school in the
- 5 district under Section 25.001 of the Education Code; and the child
- 6 is:
- 7 (A) Unable to speak and comprehend the
- 8 English language; or,
- 9 (B) Educationally disadvantaged as
- 10 established under 42 U.S.C.S. Section 1751 et seq.; or,
- 11 (C) Homeless, as defined by 42 U.S.C
- 12 Section 11302 regardless of the residence of the child, of either
- 13 parent of the child, or of the child's guardian or other person
- 14 having lawful control of the child.
- 15 (b) A child enrolled in Kindergarten-Plus remains
- 16 eligible for the duration of the program, regardless of financial
- 17 status.
- 18 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 19 of this Act, the commissioner shall adopt rules relating to the
- 20 kindergarten-plus program provided for by Section 29.1511,
- 21 Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
