SECTION 1. Section 1551.221, Insurance Code, as added by Chapter 178, Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005, is amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as follows:

policyholder.

SECTION 2. Section 1551.221, Insurance Code, as added by Chapter 899, Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005, is repealed.

voluntary supplemental SECTION 3. In implementing the health coverage program under Section 1551.221, Insurance Code, as amended by this Act, the board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System of Texas may enter into a contract based on a request for proposal before the effective date of this Act. An entity seeking to contract with the system under the program is not required to resubmit a proposal if the entity submitted a proposal before the effective date of this Act in response to the request for proposal by the board of trustees. This section expires September 1, 2008.

This Act takes effect immediately if it receives SECTION 4. a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
