## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authority of a chief appraiser to appeal from an order of an appraisal review board determining a taxpayer protest. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 42.02, Tax Code, is amended to read as 5 6 follows: Sec. 42.02. RIGHT OF APPEAL BY CHIEF APPRAISER. 7 (a) On written approval of the board of directors of the appraisal 8 district, the chief appraiser is entitled to appeal an order of the 9 appraisal review board determining: 10 (1) a taxpayer protest as provided by Subchapter C, 11 12 Chapter 41, subject to Subsection (b); or (2) a taxpayer's motion to change the appraisal roll 13 14 filed under Section 25.25. (b) The chief appraiser may not appeal an order of the 15 16 appraisal review board determining a taxpayer protest under Subsection (a)(1) if: 17 18 (1) the protest involved a determination of the appraised or market value of the taxpayer's property and that value 19 according to the order that is the subject of the appeal is less 20 21 than \$1 million; or (2) for any other taxpayer protest, the property to 22 23 which the protest applies has an appraised value according to the appraisal roll for the current year of less than \$1 million. 24

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 1 2 to an appeal by a chief appraiser from an order of an appraisal 3 review board that was issued on or after the effective date of this Act. An appeal by a chief appraiser from an order of an appraisal 4 review board that was issued before the effective date of this Act 5 6 is governed by the law in effect when the order of the appraisal review board was issued and the former law is continued in effect 7 8 for that purpose.

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
