A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to temporary change of ownership licenses for nursing home 3 facilities.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 242.0336, Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (c) through (g) and adding 7 Subsections (b-1) through (b-5), (c-1), and (d-1) to read as 8 follows:

9 (a) For purposes of this section, a temporary change of 10 ownership license is a temporary <u>90-day</u> license issued to an 11 applicant who proposes to become the new operator of an institution 12 existing on the date the application is filed.

13 (b-1) Except as provided by Subsection (b-2), the 14 department may not issue a temporary change of ownership license 15 before the 31st day after the date the department has received both: 16 (1) the application for the license; and 17 (2) notification, in writing, of the intent of the

18 <u>institution's existing license holder to transfer operation of the</u> 19 <u>institution to the applicant beginning on a date specified by the</u> 20 <u>applicant.</u>

21 (b-2) Notwithstanding Section 242.0335, the department 22 shall establish criteria under which the department may waive the 23 <u>30-day requirement or the notification requirement of Subsection</u> 24 (b-1). The criteria may include the occurrence of forcible entry

1	and detainer, death, or divorce or other events that affect the
2	ownership of the institution by the existing license holder.
3	(b-3) After receipt of an application or written
4	notification described by Subsection (b-1), the department may
5	place a hold on payments to the existing license holder in an amount
6	not to exceed the average of the monthly vendor payments paid to the
7	facility, as determined by the department. The department shall
8	release funds to the previous license holder not later than the
9	120th day after the date on which the final reporting requirements
10	are met and any resulting informal reviews or formal appeals are
11	resolved. The department may reduce the amount of funds released to
12	the previous license holder by the amount owed to the department or
13	the Health and Human Services Commission under the previous license
14	holder's Medicaid contract or license.
15	(b-4) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
16	Services Commission shall adopt rules for the department that
17	define a change of ownership. In adopting the rules, the executive
18	commissioner shall consider:
19	(1) the proportion of ownership interest that is being
20	transferred to another person;
21	(2) the addition or removal of a stockholder, partner,
22	owner, or other controlling person;
23	(3) the reorganization of the license holder into a
24	different type of business entity; and
25	(4) the death or incapacity of a stockholder, partner,
26	<u>or owner.</u>
27	(b-5) The executive commissioner may adopt rules for the

department that require a license holder to notify the department 1 2 of any change, including a change that is not a change of ownership, as that term is defined by rules adopted under Subsection (b-4). 3 4 Nothing in this section prevents the department from acting under 5 Section 242.061 or any other provision of this chapter. 6 (c) The department shall issue or deny a temporary change of ownership license not later than the 31st [30th] day after the date 7 8 of receipt of the completed application. The effective date of a 9 temporary change of ownership license issued under this section is the date requested in the application unless: 10 (1) the department does not receive the application 11 12 and written notification described by Subsection (b-1) at least 30 days before that date; and 13

(2) no waiver under Subsection (b-2) applies.

15 (c-1) If the department does not receive the application and 16 written notification required by Subsection (b-1) at least 30 days 17 before the effective date requested in the application and 18 Subsection (b-2) does not apply, the effective date of the 19 temporary change of ownership license is the 31st day after the date 20 the department receives both the application and the notification.

(d) Except as provided in Subsection (d-1), after [After] the department issues a temporary change of ownership license to the applicant, the department shall conduct an inspection or survey of the nursing facility under Section 242.043 as soon as reasonably possible. During the period between the issuance of the temporary license and the inspection or survey of the nursing facility <u>or desk</u> <u>review under Subsection (d-1)</u>, the department may not place a hold

1 on vendor payments to the temporary license holder. 2 (d-1) The department shall establish criteria under which a desk review of the facility's compliance with applicable 3 requirements may be substituted for the on-site inspection or 4 5 survey under Subsection (d). 6 (e) After conducting an inspection or survey under Subsection (d) or a desk review under Subsection (d-1), 7 the department shall issue a license under Section 242.033 to the 8 9 temporary change of ownership license holder if the nursing facility passes the desk review, inspection, or survey and the 10 applicant meets the requirements of Section 242.033. 11 If the nursing facility fails to pass the <u>desk review</u>, inspection, or 12 survey or the applicant fails to meet the requirements of Section 13 14 242.033, the department may: 15 (1) place a hold on vendor payments to the temporary 16 change of ownership license holder; and 17 (2) take any other action authorized under this chapter. 18 If the applicant meets the requirements of Section 19 (f) 242.033 and the nursing facility passes a desk review, [an] initial 20 inspection $\underline{\prime}$ or $[\underline{a}]$ subsequent inspection before the temporary 21 change of ownership license expires, the license issued under 22 Section 242.033 is considered effective on the date the department 23 determines under Subsection (c) or (c-1) [requested in the 24 application for a temporary change of ownership]. 25 (g) A temporary change of ownership license issued under 26 Subsection (b) expires on the 90th [91st] day after the effective 27

3 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 4 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 5 Services Commission shall adopt the rules required by Section 6 242.0336, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act applies only to a temporary change of ownership license application received by the Department of Aging and Disability Services on or after September 1, 2007. An application received by the department before September 1, 2007, is governed by the law in effect at the time the application is received and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
