4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 42.001, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
6	amended by adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as follows:
7	(2-a) "Nonresident landowner" means a nonresident who
8	owns real property in this state.
9	SECTION 2. The heading to Section 42.002, Parks and
10	Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:
11	Sec. 42.002. RESIDENT <u>OR NONRESIDENT LANDOWNER</u> LICENSE
12	REQUIRED; EXEMPTION.
13	SECTION 3. Sections 42.002(a) and (b), Parks and Wildlife
14	Code, are amended to read as follows:
15	(a) Except as provided by Subsections (b) and (c) [of this
16	<pre>section], no resident or nonresident landowner may hunt any bird or</pre>
17	animal in this state without having acquired a hunting license.
18	(b) A resident <u>or nonresident landowner</u> possessing a valid
19	[resident] trapper's license or fur-bearing animal propagation
20	permit is not required to have a license issued under this section
21	to take or possess the species covered by the license or permit.
22	SECTION 4. Section 42.0021, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	Sec. 42.0021. LIFETIME RESIDENT OR NONRESIDENT LANDOWNER

HUNTING LICENSE. The department may issue to residents <u>or</u> nonresident landowners of this state a lifetime resident <u>or</u> nonresident landowner hunting license.

4 SECTION 5. Sections 42.005(a) and (b), Parks and Wildlife 5 Code, are amended to read as follows:

6 (a) No nonresident in this state may hunt a mule deer, 7 white-tailed deer, turkey, pronghorn antelope, or desert bighorn 8 sheep in this state without first having acquired a general 9 nonresident hunting license <u>or a nonresident landowner hunting</u> 10 <u>license</u>.

(b) Except as provided by Subsection (f), no nonresident may hunt any bird or animal in this state without first having acquired a general nonresident hunting license, a nonresident special hunting license, [or] a nonresident five-day special hunting license, or a nonresident landowner hunting license.

16 SECTION 6. The heading to Section 42.012, Parks and 17 Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:

18 Sec. 42.012. RESIDENT <u>OR NONRESIDENT LANDOWNER</u> LICENSE 19 FEE.

20 SECTION 7. Sections 42.012(a) and (b), Parks and Wildlife 21 Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The fee for a resident <u>or nonresident landowner</u> hunting
license is \$8 or an amount set by the commission, whichever amount
is more.

(b) The commission may set a lower fee or waive the fee or license requirement for a resident <u>or nonresident landowner</u> who is under 17 years old, 65 years old or older, or participating in an

event that is sponsored or co-sponsored by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department with the approval of the executive director. The commission shall waive the fee for a qualified disabled veteran and for a resident on active duty as a member of the United States military forces.

6 SECTION 8. Section 42.0121, Parks and Wildlife Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 42.0121. LIFETIME RESIDENT <u>OR NONRESIDENT LANDOWNER</u> 9 HUNTING LICENSE FEE. The fee for a lifetime resident <u>or</u> 10 <u>nonresident landowner</u> hunting license is \$300 or an amount set by 11 the commission, whichever amount is more.

SECTION 9. Section 42.0175(a), Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:

A license issued under this chapter, other than a 14 (a) 15 lifetime resident or nonresident landowner hunting license or a nonresident five-day special hunting license is valid only during 16 17 the yearly period for which the license is issued without regard to the date on which a license is acquired. Each yearly period begins 18 on September 1 or on another date set by the commission and extends 19 through August 31 of the next year or another date set by the 20 commission. A license issued under this chapter other than a 21 nonresident five-day special hunting license that is issued before 22 September 1 or another date set by the commission and does not 23 24 expire until August 31 of the next year or another date set by the 25 commission is valid from the date of issuance through August 31 of the following year or another date set by the commission. 26 The commission by rule may set the amount of a license fee for a license 27

1 issued during a transition period at an amount lower than 2 prescribed in this chapter and provide for a license term for a 3 transition period that is shorter or longer than a year. 4 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
