A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the implementation of animal identification programs
3	and the identification and tracking of exotic livestock and exotic
4	fowl.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 161.056, Agriculture Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 161.056. [ANIMAL] IDENTIFICATION OF EXOTIC LIVESTOCK
9	AND EXOTIC FOWL [PROGRAM]. [(a) In order to provide for disease
10	control and enhance the ability to trace disease-infected animals
11	or animals that have been exposed to disease, the commission may
12	develop and implement an animal identification program that is
13	consistent with the United States Department of Agriculture's
14	National Animal Identification System.
15	[(b) The commission may recognize the following as official
16	identification numbers in the state:
17	(1) premises identification numbers assigned to each
18	geographically unique location associated with animal agriculture;
19	[(2) individual animal identification numbers; and
20	[(3) group identification numbers.
21	[(c) The commission may require the use of official
22	identification numbers assigned as part of the animal
23	identification program for animal disease control, animal
24	emergency management, and other commission programs.

1	[(d) The commission may establish a date by which all
2	premises must be registered and may assess a registration fee on all
3	entities that register for a premises identification number.
4	[(e) Information collected by the commission under this
5	section is exempt from the public disclosure requirements of
6	Chapter 552, Government Code. The commission may provide
7	information to another person, including a governmental entity,
8	without altering the confidential status of the information. The
9	commission may release information to:
10	[(1) a person who owns or controls animals and seeks
11	information regarding those animals, if the person requests the
12	information in writing;
13	[(2) the attorney general's office, for the purpose of
14	<pre>law enforcement;</pre>
15	[(3) the secretary of the United States Department of
16	Agriculture, for the purpose of animal health protection;
17	[(4) the secretary of the Department of Homeland
18	Security, for the purpose of homeland security;
19	(5) the Department of State Health Services, for the
20	purpose of protecting the public health from zoonotic diseases;
21	[(6) any person, under an order of a court of competent
22	jurisdiction;
23	[(7) a state, municipal, or county emergency
24	management authority, for the purpose of management or response to
25	natural or man-made disasters; or
26	[(8) any person the executive director of the
27	commission considers appropriate, if the executive director

1 determines that: 2 [(A) livestock may be threatened by a disease, agent, or pest; and 3 [(B) the release of the information is related to 4 5 actions the commission may take under this section. [(f) Notwithstanding Subsection (e), the commission shall 6 release information collected under this section if the release is 7 8 necessary for emergency management purposes under Chapter 418, Government Code. The release of information under this subsection 9 10 does not alter the confidential status of the information. [(g) A person commits an offense if the person fails to 11 comply with an order or rule adopted under this section. 12 [(h) An offense under Subsection (q) is a Class C 13 misdemeanor unless it is shown on the trial of the offense that the 14 15 defendant has been convicted previously under this section, in which case the offense is a Class B misdemeanor. 16 17 $[\frac{1}{2}]$ The commission may adopt rules to establish a standard method for identifying and tracking exotic livestock and exotic 18 fowl [necessary to implement and enforce this section]. The rules 19 must provide that use of the method by an owner of exotic livestock 20 21 or exotic fowl is voluntary.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
