| 7 | (3) receive pleadings and evidence; |
| 8 | (4) issue a subpoena to compel the attendance of a |

| 21 | administrative law judge's [examiner's] proposal for decision and |
| 22 | recommended order containing findings of fact and conclusions of |
| 23 | law. A party may file exceptions and replies to the board. |
| 24 | SECTION 4. This Act does not affect the validity of any |
| 25 | interagency cooperation contract entered into between the Motor |
| 26 | Vehicle Board of the Texas Department of Transportation and the |
| 27 | State Office of Administrative Hearings before the effective date |

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1 of this Act.

2 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act that relate 3 to the procedures governing a hearing before the State Office of 4 Administrative Hearings apply only to a contested case that is filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A contested case 5 6 filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, or by 7 8 an interagency cooperation contract entered into between the Motor Vehicle Board of the Texas Department of Transportation and the 9 State Office of Administrative Hearings in effect on that date, and 10 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 11

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
