4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 11.255(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) Each district-level planning and decision-making
8	committee and each campus-level planning and decision-making
9	committee for a junior, middle, or high school campus shall analyze

) 3	(3) the number of students who enter a high school

equivalency certificate program and:

- 1 (A) do not complete the program;
- 2 (B) complete the program but do not take the high
- 3 school equivalency examination; or
- 4 (C) complete the program and take the high school
- 5 equivalency examination but do not obtain a high school equivalency
- 6 certificate;
- 7 (4) for students enrolled in grade levels 9 and 10,
- 8 information related to academic credit hours earned, retention
- 9 rates, and placements in alternative education programs and
- 10 expulsions under Chapter 37; and
- 11 (5) the results of an evaluation of each school-based
- 12 dropout prevention program in the district.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 39.051(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (b) Performance on the indicators adopted under this
- 16 section shall be compared to state-established standards. The
- 17 degree of change from one school year to the next in performance on
- 18 each indicator adopted under this section shall also be considered.
- 19 The indicators must be based on information that is disaggregated
- 20 by race, ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic status and must
- 21 include:
- (1) the results of assessment instruments required
- under Sections 39.023(a), (c), and (1), aggregated by grade level
- 24 and subject area;
- 25 (2) dropout rates, including dropout rates and
- 26 district completion rates for grade levels 9 through 12, computed
- 27 in accordance with standards and definitions adopted by the

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- 1 National Center for Education Statistics of the United States
- 2 Department of Education;
- 3 (3) high school graduation rates, computed in
- 4 accordance with standards and definitions adopted in compliance
- 5 with the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Pub. L. No. 107-110);
- 6 (4) student attendance rates;
- 7 (5) the percentage of graduating students who attain
- 8 scores on the secondary exit-level assessment instruments required
- 9 under Subchapter B that are equivalent to a passing score on the
- 10 assessment instrument required under Section 51.3062;
- 11 (6) the percentage of graduating students who meet the
- 12 course requirements established for the recommended high school
- 13 program by State Board of Education rule;
- 14 (7) the results of the Scholastic Assessment Test
- 15 (SAT), the American College Test (ACT), articulated postsecondary
- 16 degree programs described by Section 61.852, and certified
- workforce training programs described by Chapter 311, Labor Code;
- 18 (8) the percentage of students, aggregated by grade
- 19 level, provided accelerated instruction under Section 28.0211(c),
- 20 the results of assessments administered under that section, the
- 21 percentage of students promoted through the grade placement
- 22 committee process under Section 28.0211, the subject of the
- 23 assessment instrument on which each student failed to perform
- 24 satisfactorily, and the performance of those students in the school
- 25 year following that promotion on the assessment instruments
- 26 required under Section 39.023;
- 27 (9) for students who have failed to perform

- 1 satisfactorily on an assessment instrument required under Section
- 2 39.023(a) or (c), the numerical progress of those students grouped
- 3 by percentage on subsequent assessment instruments required under
- 4 those sections, aggregated by grade level and subject area;
- 5 (10) the percentage of students exempted, by exemption
- 6 category, from the assessment program generally applicable under
- 7 this chapter;
- 8 (11) the percentage of students of limited English
- 9 proficiency exempted from the administration of an assessment
- instrument under Sections 39.027(a)(3) and (4);
- 11 (12) the percentage of students in a special education
- 12 program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, assessed through assessment
- instruments developed or adopted under Section 39.023(b);
- 14 (13) the measure of progress toward preparation for
- 15 postsecondary success; [and]
- 16 (14) the measure of progress toward dual language
- 17 proficiency under Section 39.034(b), for students of limited
- 18 English proficiency, as defined by Section 29.052; and
- 19 <u>(15)</u> attrition rates attributable to causes other than
- 20 students graduating, dropping out, or earning a high school
- 21 equivalency certificate, for grade levels 9 through 12.
- SECTION 3. Section 39.072, Education Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- (e) The agency may not consider a school district's
- attrition rates under Section 39.051(b)(15) in the rating of the
- 26 district under this section.
- SECTION 4. Section 39.182(a), Education Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (a) Not later than December 1 of each year, the agency shall 3 prepare and deliver to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the 4 speaker of the house of representatives, each member of the 5 legislature, the Legislative Budget Board, and the clerks of the 6 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with
- 6 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with
- 7 primary jurisdiction over the public school system a comprehensive
- 8 report covering the preceding school year and containing:
- 9 (1) an evaluation of the achievements of the state 10 educational program in relation to the statutory goals for the
- 11 public education system under Section 4.002;
- 12 (2) an evaluation of the status of education in the 13 state as reflected by the academic excellence indicators adopted
- 14 under Section 39.051;
- 15 (3) a summary compilation of overall student
- 16 performance on academic skills assessment instruments required by
- 17 Section 39.023 with the number and percentage of students exempted
- 18 from the administration of those instruments and the basis of the
- 19 exemptions, aggregated by grade level, subject area, campus, and
- 20 district, with appropriate interpretations and analysis, and
- 21 disaggregated by race, ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic
- 22 status;
- 23 (4) a summary compilation of overall performance of
- 24 students placed in a disciplinary alternative education program
- 25 established under Section 37.008 on academic skills assessment
- 26 instruments required by Section 39.023 with the number of those
- 27 students exempted from the administration of those instruments and

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- 1 the basis of the exemptions, aggregated by district, grade level,
- 2 and subject area, with appropriate interpretations and analysis,
- 3 and disaggregated by race, ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic
- 4 status;
- 5 (5) a summary compilation of overall performance of
- 6 students at risk of dropping out of school, as defined by Section
- 7 29.081(d), on academic skills assessment instruments required by
- 8 Section 39.023 with the number of those students exempted from the
- 9 administration of those instruments and the basis of the
- 10 exemptions, aggregated by district, grade level, and subject area,
- 11 with appropriate interpretations and analysis, and disaggregated
- 12 by race, ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic status;
- 13 (6) an evaluation of the correlation between student
- 14 grades and student performance on academic skills assessment
- instruments required by Section 39.023;
- 16 (7) a statement of the dropout rate of students in
- 17 grade levels 7 through 12, expressed in the aggregate and by grade
- 18 level, and a statement of the completion rates and the attrition
- 19 rates under Section 39.051(b)(15) of students for grade levels 9
- 20 through 12;
- 21 (8) a statement of:
- 22 (A) the completion rate of students who enter
- 23 grade level 9 and graduate not more than four years later;
- 24 (B) the completion rate of students who enter
- 25 grade level 9 and graduate, including students who require more
- 26 than four years to graduate;
- (C) the completion rate of students who enter

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- 1 grade level 9 and not more than four years later receive a high
- 2 school equivalency certificate;
- 3 (D) the completion rate of students who enter
- 4 grade level 9 and receive a high school equivalency certificate,
- 5 including students who require more than four years to receive a
- 6 certificate; and
- 7 (E) the number and percentage of all students who
- 8 have not been accounted for under Paragraph (A), (B), (C), or (D);
- 9 (9) a statement of the projected cross-sectional and
- 10 longitudinal dropout rates for grade levels 9 through 12 for the
- 11 next five years, assuming no state action is taken to reduce the
- 12 dropout rate;
- 13 (10) a description of a systematic, measurable plan
- 14 for reducing the projected cross-sectional and longitudinal
- dropout rates to five percent or less for the 1997-1998 school year;
- 16 (11) a summary of the information required by Section
- 17 29.083 regarding grade level retention of students and information
- 18 concerning:
- 19 (A) the number and percentage of students
- 20 retained; and
- 21 (B) the performance of retained students on
- 22 assessment instruments required under Section 39.023(a);
- 23 (12) information, aggregated by district type and
- 24 disaggregated by race, ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic
- 25 status, on:
- 26 (A) the number of students placed in a
- 27 disciplinary alternative education program established under

- 1 Section 37.008;
- 2 (B) the average length of a student's placement
- 3 in a disciplinary alternative education program established under
- 4 Section 37.008;
- 5 (C) the academic performance of students on
- 6 assessment instruments required under Section 39.023(a) during the
- 7 year preceding and during the year following placement in a
- 8 disciplinary alternative education program; and
- 9 (D) the dropout rates of students who have been
- 10 placed in a disciplinary alternative education program established
- 11 under Section 37.008;
- 12 (13) a list of each school district or campus that does
- 13 not satisfy performance standards, with an explanation of the
- 14 actions taken by the commissioner to improve student performance in
- 15 the district or campus and an evaluation of the results of those
- 16 actions;
- 17 (14) an evaluation of the status of the curriculum
- 18 taught in public schools, with recommendations for legislative
- 19 changes necessary to improve or modify the curriculum required by
- 20 Section 28.002;
- 21 (15) a description of all funds received by and each
- 22 activity and expenditure of the agency;
- 23 (16) a summary and analysis of the instructional
- 24 expenditures ratios and instructional employees ratios of school
- districts computed under Section 44.0071;
- 26 (17) a summary of the effect of deregulation,
- 27 including exemptions and waivers granted under Section 7.056 or

- 1 39.112;
- 2 (18) a statement of the total number and length of
- 3 reports that school districts and school district employees must
- 4 submit to the agency, identifying which reports are required by
- 5 federal statute or rule, state statute, or agency rule, and a
- 6 summary of the agency's efforts to reduce overall reporting
- 7 requirements;
- 8 (19) a list of each school district that is not in
- 9 compliance with state special education requirements, including:
- 10 (A) the period for which the district has not
- 11 been in compliance;
- 12 (B) the manner in which the agency considered the
- 13 district's failure to comply in determining the district's
- 14 accreditation status; and
- 15 (C) an explanation of the actions taken by the
- 16 commissioner to ensure compliance and an evaluation of the results
- 17 of those actions;
- 18 (20) a comparison of the performance of
- 19 open-enrollment charter schools and school districts on the
- 20 academic excellence indicators specified in Section 39.051(b) and
- 21 accountability measures adopted under Section 39.051(g), with a
- 22 separately aggregated comparison of the performance of
- 23 open-enrollment charter schools predominantly serving students at
- 24 risk of dropping out of school, as defined by Section 29.081(d),
- with the performance of school districts;
- 26 (21) a summary of the information required by Section
- 27 38.0141 regarding student health and physical activity from each

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- 1 school district; and
- 2 (22) any additional information considered important
- 3 by the commissioner or the State Board of Education.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
