## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to immigration law training for certain law enforcement 3 officers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended 6 by adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:
- (k) After September 1, 2008, as part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the commission shall require an applicant for a license as an officer under this chapter to complete immigration law training described by Section 1701.3522(b). Not later than the date prescribed by the commission, the applicant
- 12 <u>shall</u> submit to the commission written certification from the
- 13 appropriate federal agency that the applicant has completed
- immigration law training described by Section 1701.3522(b).
- SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 1701.3522 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1701.3522. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING; IMMIGRATION

  LAW TRAINING FOR CERTAIN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS. (a) In this

  section, "law enforcement officer" means an individual elected,

  appointed, or employed to serve as a peace officer for a

  governmental entity of this state under Article 2.12, Code of

  Criminal Procedure.
- 23 <u>(b) The commission shall enter into a memorandum of</u> 24 understanding with Immigration and Customs Enforcement, a division

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- of the federal Department of Homeland Security, or its successor
- 2 agency, to provide law enforcement officers with immigration law
- 3 training under the supervision of Immigration and Customs
- 4 Enforcement officers as provided by Section 287(g), Immigration and
- 5 Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. Section 1357).
- 6 (c) The commission shall require a state, county, or
- 7 <u>municipal agency that appoints or employs law enforcement officers</u>
- 8 to make available to those officers immigration law continuing
- 9 education training described by Subsection (b).
- 10 (d) The commission shall require a municipality to provide
- 11 immigration law continuing education training described by
- 12 Subsection (b) to not less than:
- 13 (1) two percent of the municipality's law enforcement
- officers, in a municipality with a population of 50,000 or more;
- 15 (2) one percent of the municipality's law enforcement
- officers, in a municipality with a population of 25,000 or more but
- 17 not more than 49,999;
- 18 (3) 0.5 percent of the municipality's law enforcement
- officers, in a municipality with a population of 10,000 or more but
- 20 not more than 24,999; and
- 21 (4) 0.25 percent of the municipality's law enforcement
- officers, in a municipality with a population of less than 10,000.
- (e) The commission shall require a county to provide
- 24 immigration law continuing education training described by
- 25 Subsection (b) to not less than:
- 26 (1) two percent of the county's law enforcement
- officers, in a county with a population of more than 50,000;

- 1 (2) one percent of the county's law enforcement
- 2 officers, in a county with a population of 25,001 or more but not
- 3 more than 50,000;
- 4 (3) 0.5 percent of the county's law enforcement
- officers, in a county with a population of 10,001 or more but not
- 6 more than 25,000;
- 7 (4) four of the county's law enforcement officers, in a
- 8 county with a population of 5,000 or more but not more than 10,000;
- 9 <u>and</u>
- 10 (5) two of the county's law enforcement officers, in a
- 11 county with a population of less than 5,000.
- 12 (f) The commission shall adopt rules for the administration
- 13 of this section.
- SECTION 3. Section 96.641, Education Code, is amended by
- 15 adding Subsection (n) to read as follows:
- (n) After September 1, 2008, as part of the initial training
- 17 and continuing education for police chiefs required under this
- 18 section, the institute shall require a newly appointed or elected
- 19 police chief to complete immigration law training described by
- 20 Section 1701.3522(b).
- 21 SECTION 4. Not later than October 1, 2007, the Commission on
- 22 Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education shall adopt rules
- 23 as required by this Act.
- 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
