8	PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATIONS. (a) The executive commissioner shall
9	adopt rules to ensure that, in developing protocols for the use of

L1	this state, including the foster care program administered by the
L2	Department of Family and Protective Services, the commission or a
L3	health and human services agency does not collaborate with or
L4	otherwise accept assistance or advice from any person who:
L5	(1) during the three-year period preceding the
L6	development of the protocols:
L7	(A) was employed by a pharmaceutical company; or
L8	(B) conducted or assisted in the conduct of a
L9	study, a clinical trial, or any other activity that was financed by
20	a pharmaceutical company; or
21	(2) has a financial interest in a pharmaceutical

23	(b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to ensure
24	that no person, including a state employee, who collaborates with

- or otherwise assists or advises the commission or a health and human
  services agency in developing protocols for the use of psychotropic
  medications in health and human services programs in this state,
  including the foster care program, receives a donation, gift, or
  other money from a pharmaceutical company or another person that
- 5 other money from a pharmaceutical company or another person that 6 has a financial interest in a psychotropic medication.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
