- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 4 SECTION 1. Section 26.3574(b), Water Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) A fee is imposed on the delivery of a petroleum product 7 on withdrawal from bulk of that product as provided by this 8 subsection. Each operator of a bulk facility on withdrawal from 9 bulk of a petroleum product shall collect from the person who orders
- 11 (1) \$3.75 [\$12.50] for each delivery into a cargo tank
 12 having a capacity of less than 2,500 gallons [for the state fiscal

- 14 beginning September 1, 2002; and \$10.00 for each delivery into a
- 15 cargo tank having a capacity of less than 2,500 gallons for the
- 16 state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state

- 18 (2) $\frac{\$7.50}{\$25.00}$ [\$\frac{\\$25.00}{\$} for each delivery into a cargo tank
- 19 having a capacity of 2,500 gallons or more but less than 5,000
- 20 gallons [for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and
- 21 the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$20.00 for
- 22 each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 2,500 gallons
- 23 or more but less than 5,000 gallons for the state fiscal year
- 24 beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending

1 August 31, 2007];

- \$11.75 [\frac{\frac{37.50}}{37.50}] for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 5,000 gallons or more but less than 8,000 gallons [for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$30.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 5,000 gallons or more but less than 8,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007];
 - (4) \$15.00 [\$50.00] for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 8,000 gallons or more but less than 10,000 gallons [for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$40.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 8,000 gallons or more but less than 10,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007]; and
 - (5) \$7.50 [a \$25.00 fee] for each increment of 5,000 gallons or any part thereof delivered into a cargo tank having a capacity of 10,000 gallons or more [for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$20.00 for each increment of 5,000 gallons or any part thereof delivered into a cargo tank having a capacity of 10,000 gallons or more for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007].
- 27 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to

- 1 a fee imposed on the delivery of a petroleum product on or after the
- 2 effective date of this Act. A fee imposed on the delivery of a
- 3 petroleum product before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 4 by the former law, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 5 purpose.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
