## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to fees on delivery of certain petroleum products.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 26.3574(b), Water Code, is amended to read as follows:
  - (b) A fee is imposed on the delivery of a petroleum product on withdrawal from bulk of that product as provided by this subsection. Each operator of a bulk facility on withdrawal from bulk of a petroleum product shall collect from the person who orders the withdrawal a fee in an amount determined as follows:
  - (1) [\$12.50 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of less than 2,500 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$10.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of less than 2,500 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007; \$5.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of less than 2,500 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2007 and every fiscal year thereafter.
  - (2) [\$25.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 2,500 gallons or more but less than 5,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$20.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 2,500 gallons or

more but less than 5,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning

September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31,

2007; \$10.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity

of 2,500 gallons or more but less than 5,000 gallons for the state

fiscal year beginning September 1, 2007 and every fiscal year

thereafter.

- (3) [\$37.50 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 5,000 gallons or more but less than 8,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$30.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 5,000 gallons or more but less than 8,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007; \$15.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 5,000 gallons or more but less than 8,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2007 and every fiscal year thereafter.
- (4) [\$50.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 8,000 gallons or more but less than 10,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002; and \$40.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 8,000 gallons or more but less than 10,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007; \$20.00 for each delivery into a cargo tank having a capacity of 8,000 gallons or more but less than 10,000 gallons for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2007 and every fiscal

## year thereafter; and

- or any part thereof delivered into a cargo tank having a capacity of 10,000 gallons or more for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2001, and the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2002, and \$20.00 for each increment of 5,000 gallons or any part thereof delivered into a cargo tank having a capacity of 10,000 gallons or more for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2003, through the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007.] \$10.00 for each increment of 5,000 gallons or any part thereof delivered into a cargo tank having a capacity of 10,000 gallons or more for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007.] \$10.00 for each increment of 5,000 gallons or any part thereof delivered into a cargo tank having a capacity of 10,000 gallons or more for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2007 and every fiscal year thereafter.
- SECTION 2. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
  may adopt rules implementing the changes in law effected by this
  Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
