## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the distribution of funds at the local level under the
- 3 awards for student achievement program and the educator excellence
- 4 awards program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 21.656(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) An eligible campus must use <u>a portion</u> [75 percent] of a
- 9 grant award received under Section 21.655 to provide incentive
- 10 payments to classroom teachers assigned to the campus. To the
- 11 extent practicable, the campus shall pay a classroom teacher an
- incentive payment in an amount of not less than \$3,000 or more than
- 13 \$10,000.
- SECTION 2. Section 21.657(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) An eligible campus must use <u>any portion</u> [<del>25 percent</del>] of
- 17 a grant award received under Section 21.655 that is not used to
- 18 provide incentive payments to classroom teachers under Section
- 19 21.656 for:
- 20 (1) incentive payments to campus employees other than
- 21 classroom teachers, such as principals, assistant principals,
- 22 teachers who are not eligible for an incentive payment under
- 23 Section 21.656, counselors, speech therapists, instructional
- 24 coaches, teacher's aides, nurses, librarians, members of the

- 1 custodial staff, or other campus employees who have contributed to
- 2 improved student achievement;
- 3 (2) professional development for classroom teachers
- 4 who:
- 5 (A) do not receive an incentive payment under
- 6 Section 21.656; and
- 7 (B) would benefit from professional development
- 8 to develop or enhance skills and behaviors described under Section
- 9 21.656(b);
- 10 (3) reimbursement or funding for a professional
- 11 development activity that directly contributes to improved
- 12 classroom instruction and student achievement;
- 13 (4) signing bonuses for classroom teachers new to the
- 14 campus who are teaching subjects that have been designated by the
- 15 commissioner as historically experiencing a critical shortage of
- 16 teachers;
- 17 (5) a teacher mentoring program that meets the
- 18 requirements of Section 21.458;
- 19 (6) an activity that supports new teacher induction
- 20 programs, including:
- 21 (A) common planning time and collaboration;
- 22 (B) a professional development activity; and
- 23 (C) standards-based evaluations;
- 24 (7) an activity that supports common planning time and
- 25 curriculum development;
- 26 (8) a program that has been proven to recruit and
- 27 retain highly effective teachers;

- 1 (9) an activity that creates or furthers the goals of
- 2 an incentive system designed to improve student achievement;
- 3 (10) stipends for teachers who participate in an
- 4 after-school or Saturday program that directly contributes to
- 5 improved classroom instruction and student achievement;
- 6 (11) stipends for teachers who are certified under
- 7 Subchapter B in the main subject area in which they teach;
- 8 (12) stipends for teachers who hold a postgraduate
- 9 degree;
- 10 (13) additional funding for feeder campuses that,
- 11 because they are not assigned performance ratings under Chapter 39,
- do not qualify to participate in the program, such as campuses that
- 13 serve kindergarten through grade two, to implement an activity
- 14 described by this section; and
- 15 (14) any other program that directly contributes to
- 16 improved student achievement.
- 17 SECTION 3. Section 21.705, Education Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 21.705. AWARD PAYMENTS. A school district must use a
- 20 portion [at least 60 percent] of grant funds awarded to the district
- 21 under this subchapter to directly award classroom teachers who
- 22 effectively improve student achievement as determined by
- 23 meaningful, objective measures. The remaining funds must be used
- 24 only to:
- 25 (1) provide stipends to effective mentors or teacher
- 26 coaches;
- 27 (2) provide stipends to classroom teachers who are

- 1 certified in a subject that is designated by the commissioner as
- 2 commonly experiencing a critical shortage of teachers;
- 3 (3) provide stipends to classroom teachers who are
- 4 certified under Subchapter B in the main subject area in which they
- 5 teach;
- 6 (4) provide stipends to classroom teachers with proven
- 7 records of success for improving student performance who are
- 8 assigned to campuses at which the district has experienced
- 9 difficulty assigning or retaining teachers;
- 10 (5) provide stipends to classroom teachers who hold
- 11 postgraduate degrees;
- 12 (6) provide awards to principals who effectively
- increase student performance as determined by objective measures;
- 14 (7) provide awards to other campus employees who
- 15 demonstrate excellence; or
- 16 (8) implement the components of a Teacher Advancement
- 17 Program (TAP), including:
- 18 (A) an instructionally focused accountability
- 19 system; and
- 20 (B) the adjustment of teaching schedules to
- 21 permit ongoing applied professional growth.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008
- 23 school year.
- 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

1 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
