A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to unemployment compensation information confidentiality,
- 3 and providing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 301.081, Subchapter F, Chapter 301,
- 6 Labor Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 301.081. EMPLOYEE RECORDS OF EMPLOYING UNIT; OFFENSE;
- 8 PENALTY. (a) Each employing unit shall keep employment records
- 9 containing information as prescribed by the commission and as
- 10 necessary for the proper administration of this title. The records
- 11 are open to inspection and may be copied by the commission or an
- 12 authorized representative of the commission at any reasonable time
- 13 and as often as necessary.
- 14 (b) The commission may require from an employing unit sworn
- or unsworn reports regarding persons employed by the employing unit
- 16 as necessary for the effective administration of this title.
- 17 (c) Employment information thus obtained or otherwise
- 18 secured may not be published and is not open to public inspection,
- 19 other than to a public employee in the performance of public duties,
- 20 except as the commission considers necessary for the proper
- 21 administration of this title or as provided by commission rule and
- 22 consistent with federal law.
- 23 (d) A person commits an offense if the person [is an
- 24 employee or member of the commission who] violates any provision of

- 1 this section. An offense under this subsection constitutes a Class
- 2 A Misdemeanor. [is punishable by a fine of not less than \$20 nor
- 3 more than \$200, confinement in jail for not more than 90 days, or
- 4 both fine and confinement.]
- 5 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 301, Labor Code is amended
- 6 by adding Sections 301.085 and 301.086 to read as follows:
- 7 <u>Sec. 301.085.</u> DISCLOSURE AND CONFIDENTIALITY OF
- 8 <u>INFORMATION</u>. (a) "Unemployment compensation information" means
- 9 information in the records of the Texas Workforce Commission that
- 10 pertains to the administration of the Texas Unemployment
- 11 Compensation Act, as provided in this title, including all
- information collected, received, developed, and maintained in the
- 13 administration of the unemployment compensation benefits system
- 14 and in the administration of the unemployment compensation tax
- 15 system.
- (b) Consistent with federal law, the commission shall
- 17 establish and enforce reasonable rules governing the
- 18 confidentiality, custody, use, preservation and disclosure of
- 19 unemployment compensation information.
- 20 (c) In establishing rules under subsection (b), the
- 21 commission shall, by rule, include safeguards which protect the
- 22 <u>confidentiality of identifying information or particulars about</u>
- 23 any individual or any past or present employer or employing unit
- 24 contained in unemployment compensation information, including any
- 25 information which could foreseeably be combined with other publicly
- 26 available information to reveal identifying information or
- 27 particulars about any individual or past or present employer or

- 1 <u>employing unit.</u>
- 2 (d) Unemployment compensation information is not subject to
- 3 the provisions of Chapter 552, Texas Government Code.
- 4 Sec. 301.086. DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN INFORMATION
- 5 PROHIBITED; OFFENSE; PENALTY. (a) Except as permitted under this
- 6 subchapter and commission rule, it is an offense for a person to
- 7 solicit, disclose, receive, or make use of, or to authorize,
- 8 permit, participate in, or acquiesce in the use of unemployment
- 9 compensation information revealing identifying information or
- 10 particulars regarding:
- 11 (1) any individual,
- 12 (2) any past or present employer or employing unit, or
- 13 (3) any information which could foreseeably be
- 14 combined with other publicly available information to reveal
- 15 identifying information or particulars about any individual or past
- or present employer or employing unit.
- 17 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
