## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to performance incentive funding for institutions of
3	higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter EE to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER EE. PERFORMANCE INCENTIVE FUNDING
8	Sec. 61.9801. PERFORMANCE INCENTIVE FUNDING FOR CERTAIN
9	GENERAL ACADEMIC TEACHING INSTITUTIONS. (a) This section applies
10	only to general academic teaching institutions other than public
11	state colleges.
12	(b) In this section:
13	(1) "Advanced degree" means a graduate or professional
14	degree for which a baccalaureate degree is usually required as a
15	prerequisite to admission into the degree program.
16	(2) "At-risk student" means a student of an
17	institution to which this section applies:
18	(A) whose score on the Scholastic Assessment Test
19	or the American College Test is less than the national mean score of
20	students' scores on that test;
21	(B) who has been awarded a grant under the
22	federal Pell Grant program;
23	(C) who was 20 years of age or older but younger

than 60 years of age on the date the student initially enrolled in

1	the institution;
2	(D) who initially enrolled in the institution for
3	less than 12 semester credit hours during a fall or spring semester;
4	(E) who did not receive a high school diploma but
5	received a high school equivalency certificate;
6	(F) who may not be claimed by any other person as
7	a dependent for federal income tax purposes but may claim at least
8	one other person as a dependent for federal income tax purposes; or
9	(G) who is a single parent.
10	(3) "Critical field" means a field of study designated
11	as a critical field under Subsection (c).
12	(4) "Major field test":
13	(A) means an examination or other assessment that
14	<u>is:</u>
15	(i) designed to measure the basic knowledge
16	and understanding achieved by a student in a major field of study;
17	and
18	(ii) approved by the board for purposes of
19	this section; and
20	(B) includes any examination required for the
21	issuance of a professional or occupational license directly related
22	to the student's field of study.
23	(c) Except as otherwise provided under Subdivision (2), the
24	fields of engineering, computer science, mathematics, physical
25	science, allied health, nursing, and teaching certification in the
26	field of science or mathematics are critical fields. Beginning
27	September 1, 2010, the board, based on the board's determination of

- 1 those fields of study in which the support and development of
- 2 postsecondary education programs at the bachelor's degree or
- 3 advanced degree level are most critically necessary for serving the
- 4 needs of this state, by rule may:
- 5 (1) designate as a critical field a field of study that
- 6 is not currently designated by this subsection or by the board as a
- 7 <u>critical field; or</u>
- 8 (2) remove a field of study from the list of fields
- 9 currently designated by this subsection or by the board as critical
- 10 <u>fields</u>.
- 11 (d) For purposes of this section, a student's assessment
- 12 score percentage on a major field test is computed by dividing a
- 13 student's score on the test by:
- 14 (1) the national average of students' scores on that
- 15 test; or
- 16 (2) the statewide average of students' scores on that
- 17 test if the test is not administered nationally.
- (e) For each state fiscal year, the board shall distribute
- 19 any performance incentive funds appropriated by the legislature for
- 20 the purposes of this section, and any other funds made available for
- 21 the purposes of this section, to institutions to which this section
- 22 applies in proportion to the number of points assigned to each
- 23 <u>institution under the tables prescribed by Subsections (g) and (h).</u>
- 24 (f) A number of points is assigned in accordance with
- 25 Subsections (g) and (h) only on the basis of a degree awarded or a
- 26 performance on a major field test taken during the state fiscal year
- 27 preceding the year for which the distribution of funds under this

- 1 <u>section is made.</u> Points may not be assigned for any degree awarded
- 2 to an international student.
- 3 (g) A number of points is assigned for a bachelor's degree
- 4 awarded to a student by an institution to which this section applies
- 5 based on the student's performance on a major field assessment and
- 6 determined according to the following table:

- 27 (1) designate as a general education test a test or

- 3 (2) after September 1, 2010, remove a test or other

- 7 <u>(e) For purposes of this section, a student's assessment</u>
- 8 score percentage on a general education test is computed by
- 9 dividing a student's score on the test by:
- 10 <u>(1) the national average of students' scores on that</u>

- 12 (2) the statewide average of students' scores on that
- 13 test if the test is not administered nationally.
- 14 (f) For each state fiscal year, the board shall distribute
- any performance incentive funds appropriated by the legislature for
- the purposes of this section, and any other funds made available for
- 17 the purposes of this section, to institutions to which this section
- 18 applies in proportion to the number of points assigned to each
- institution under the tables prescribed by Subsections (h) and (i).
- 20 (g) A number of points is assigned in accordance with
- 21 Subsections (h) and (i) only on the basis of a degree or certificate
- 22 awarded, a performance on a general education test taken, or a
- 23 student transfer made during the state fiscal year preceding the
- 24 year for which the distribution of funds under this section is made.
- 25 Points may not be assigned for any degree or certificate awarded:
- 26 (1) in a program on a topic or at a level that the board
- 27 determines does not merit funding under this section; or

PASSING SCORE ON MAJOR FIELD TEST OR GENERAL 7 EDUCATION TEST NOT REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION. This subchapter does 8 not require any student to receive a passing score on a major field 9 test, as defined by Section 61.9801, or a general education test, as defined by Section 61.9802, as a prerequisite to graduating from an 10 institution of higher education. 11 Sec. 61.9807. PAYMENT BY INSTITUTION OF COST OF MAJOR FIELD 12 TEST OR GENERAL EDUCATION TEST. An institution of higher education 13 14 that administers a major field test as defined by Section 61.9801, 15 or a general education test as defined by Section 61.9802, to a student for purposes of this subchapter shall pay for the cost of 16 17 the test, unless the test is an examination required for the issuance of a professional or occupational license. 18 Sec. 61.9808. REPORT OF GRE, GMAT, LSAT, OR MCAT SCORE TO 19 INSTITUTIONS BY ADMINISTERING ENTITY. (a) An entity that 20 21 administers to a person in this state a Graduate Record Examination (GRE), the Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT), the Law 22 School Admissions Test (LSAT), or the Medical College Admission 23 24 Test (MCAT) shall report the person's score on the examination to:

- 12 (c) The board shall prescribe procedures and take other
- 13 actions the board considers appropriate to promote compliance with
- 14 this section.
- Sec. 61.9809. REPORT OF GRE, GMAT, LSAT, OR MCAT SCORES ON
- 16 TRANSCRIPTS BY INSTITUTIONS. An institution of higher education
- 17 that receives an examination score for a student or graduate of the
- 18 institution on an examination under Section 61.9808 shall include
- 19 the student's score on the student's transcript.
- Sec. 61.9810. REPORT TO BOARD AND LEGISLATURE BY EDUCATION
- 21 RESEARCH CENTER REGARDING EVALUATION OF POINT ASSIGNMENTS. Each
- 22 state fiscal biennium, the board shall provide for the evaluation
- 23 by an education research center established under Section 1.005 of
- 24 the points assigned under Sections 61.9801, 61.9802, and 61.9803.
- Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year, the education
- 26 research center shall submit to the board and the legislature a
- 27 written report regarding the center's evaluation under this

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- 1 section, including any recommendations for changes to the points
- 2 <u>assigned under those sections.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 61.0591, Education Code, is repealed.
- 4 SECTION 3. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 5 shall adopt rules relating to the administration of Subchapter EE,
- 6 Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as
- 7 practicable after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. Sections 61.9808 and 61.9809, Education Code, as
- 9 added by this Act, apply only to an examination score of a person
- 10 who registers for the examination on or after the effective date of
- 11 this Act. An examination score of a person who registers for the
- 12 examination before the effective date of this Act is covered by the
- 13 law in effect immediately before that date, and the former law is
- 14 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2008.
