5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. INTERNATIONAL MANAGEMENT DISTRICT. Subtitle C,
7	Title 4, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding
8	Chapter 3849 to read as follows:
9	CHAPTER 3849. INTERNATIONAL MANAGEMENT DISTRICT
10	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
11	Sec. 3849.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
12	(1) "Board" means the board of directors of the
13	district.
14	(2) "District" means the International Management
15	District.
16	Sec. 3849.002. INTERNATIONAL MANAGEMENT DISTRICT. The
17	district is a special district created under Section 59, Article
18	XVI, Texas Constitution.
19	Sec. 3849.003. PURPOSE; DECLARATION OF INTENT. (a) The
20	creation of the district is essential to accomplish the purposes of
21	Sections 52 and 52-a, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI,
22	Texas Constitution, and other public purposes stated in this
23	chapter. By creating the district and in authorizing the City of
24	Houston, Harris County, and other political subdivisions to

1	contract with the district, the legislature has established a
2	program to accomplish the public purposes set out in Section 52-a,
3	Article III, Texas Constitution.
4	(b) The creation of the district is necessary to promote,
5	develop, encourage, and maintain employment, commerce,
6	transportation, housing, tourism, recreation, the arts,
7	entertainment, economic development, safety, and the public
8	welfare in the area of the district.
9	(c) This chapter and the creation of the district may not be
10	interpreted to relieve Harris County or the City of Houston from
11	providing the level of services provided as of the effective date of
12	this Act, to the area in the district. The district is created to
13	supplement and not to supplant the county or municipal services
14	provided in the area in the district.
15	Sec. 3849.004. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE. (a)
16	The district is created to serve a public use and benefit.
17	(b) All land and other property included in the district
18	will benefit from the improvements and services to be provided by
19	the district under powers conferred by Sections 52 and 52-a,
20	Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and
21	other powers granted under this chapter.
22	(c) The creation of the district is in the public interest
23	and is essential to:
24	(1) further the public purposes of developing and
25	diversifying the economy of the state;
26	(2) eliminate unemployment and underemployment; and
27	(3) develop or expand transportation and commerce.

1	(d) The district will:
2	(1) promote the health, safety, and general welfare of
3	residents, employers, potential employees, employees, visitors,
4	and consumers in the district, and of the public;
5	(2) provide needed funding for the district to
6	preserve, maintain, and enhance the economic health and vitality of
7	the district territory as a community and business center; and
8	(3) promote the health, safety, welfare, and enjoyment
9	of the public by providing pedestrian ways and by landscaping and
10	developing certain areas in the district, which are necessary for
11	the restoration, preservation, and enhancement of scenic beauty.
12	(e) Pedestrian ways along or across a street, whether at
13	grade or above or below the surface, and street lighting, street
14	landscaping, and street art objects are parts of and necessary
15	components of a street and are considered to be a street or road
16	improvement.
17	(f) The district will not act as the agent or
18	instrumentality of any private interest even though the district
19	will benefit many private interests as well as the public.
20	Sec. 3849.005. DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The district is
21	composed of the territory described by Section 2 of the Act enacting
22	this chapter, as that territory may have been modified under:
23	(1) Section 3849.106;
24	(2) Subchapter J, Chapter 49, Water Code; or
25	(3) other law.
26	(b) The boundaries and field notes of the district contained
27	in Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A

1	mistake in the field notes or in copying the field notes in the
2	legislative process does not in any way affect the district's:
3	(1) organization, existence, or validity;
4	(2) right to issue any type of bond for a purpose for
5	which the district is created or to pay the principal of and
6	interest on the bond;
7	(3) right to impose or collect an assessment or tax; or
8	(4) legality or operation.
9	Sec. 3849.006. ELIGIBILITY FOR INCLUSION IN SPECIAL ZONES.
10	All or any part of the area of the district is eligible to be
11	included in:
12	(1) a tax increment reinvestment zone created by a
13	municipality under Chapter 311, Tax Code;
14	(2) a tax abatement reinvestment zone created by a
15	municipality under Chapter 312, Tax Code; or
16	(3) an enterprise zone created by a municipality under
17	Chapter 2303, Government Code.
18	Sec. 3849.007. APPLICABILITY OF MUNICIPAL MANAGEMENT
19	DISTRICTS LAW. Except as otherwise provided by this chapter,
20	Chapter 375, Local Government Code, applies to the district.
21	Sec. 3849.008. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This
22	chapter shall be liberally construed in conformity with the
23	findings and purposes stated in this chapter.
24	[Sections 3849.009-3849.050 reserved for expansion]
25	SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
26	Sec. 3849.051. BOARD OF DIRECTORS; TERMS. (a) The
27	district is governed by a board of 11 voting directors who serve

1	staggered terms of four years, with five or six directors' term
2	expiring June 1 of each odd-numbered year.
3	(b) The board by resolution may change the number of votin
4	directors on the board, but only if the board determines that th
5	change is in the best interest of the district. The board may no
6	consist of fewer than five or more than 15 voting directors.
7	Sec. 3849.052. APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS ON INCREASE I
8	BOARD SIZE. If the board increases the number of directors unde
9	Section 3849.051, the board shall appoint qualified persons to fil
10	the new director positions and shall provide for staggering th
11	terms of the directors serving in the new positions.
12	Sec. 3849.053. APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS. The mayor an
13	members of the governing body of the City of Houston shall appoin
14	voting directors from persons recommended by the board. A person i
15	appointed if a majority of the members of the governing body
16	including the mayor, vote to appoint that person.
17	Sec. 3849.054. QUORUM. For purposes of determining whethe
18	a quorum of the board is present, the following are not counted:
19	(1) a board position vacant for any reason, includin
20	death, resignation, or disqualification; or
21	(2) a director who is abstaining from participation i
22	a vote because of a conflict of interest.
23	Sec. 3849.055. INITIAL VOTING DIRECTORS. (a) The initia

17	SUBCHAPTER C.	POWERS AND DUTIES
18	Sec. 3849.101. GENERAL	POWERS. The district may exercise
19	all powers necessary to acco	mplish the purposes for which the
20	district was created.	
21	Sec. 3849.102. EXERCISE	E OF POWERS OF OTHER GOVERNMENTAL
22	ENTITIES. The district has the	powers of:
23	(1) a corporatio	on created under Section 4B,
24	Development Corporation Act of	1979 (Article 5190.6, Vernon's Texas
25	Civil Statutes), including th	ne power to own, operate, acquire,
26	construct, lease, improve, and	maintain projects described by that
27	section; and	

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1	(2) a housing finance corporation created under
2	Chapter 394, Local Government Code.
3	Sec. 3849.103. NONPROFIT CORPORATION. (a) The board by
4	resolution may authorize the creation of a nonprofit corporation to
5	assist and act for the district in implementing a project or
6	providing a service authorized by this chapter.
7	(b) The nonprofit corporation:
8	(1) has each power of and is considered for purposes of
9	this chapter to be a local government corporation created under
10	Chapter 431, Transportation Code; and
11	(2) may implement any project and provide any service
12	authorized by this chapter.
13	(c) The board shall appoint the board of directors of the
14	nonprofit corporation. The board of directors of the nonprofit
15	corporation shall serve in the same manner as the board of directors
16	of a local government corporation created under Chapter 431,
17	Transportation Code, except that a board member is not required to
18	reside in the district.
19	Sec. 3849.104. AGREEMENTS; GRANTS. (a) The district may
20	make an agreement with or accept a gift, grant, or loan from any
21	person.
22	(b) The implementation of a project is a governmental
23	function or service for the purposes of Chapter 791, Government
24	Code.
25	Sec. 3849.105. AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT.
26	To protect the public interest, the district may contract with a
27	qualified party, including Harris County or the City of Houston, to

1	provide law enforcement services in the district for a fee.
2	Sec. 3849.106. ANNEXATION OR EXCLUSION OF TERRITORY. The
3	district may annex or exclude land from the district in the manner
4	provided by Subchapter C, Chapter 375, Local Government Code.
5	Sec. 3849.107. APPROVAL BY CITY OF HOUSTON. (a) Except as
6	provided by Subsection (c), the district must obtain the approval
7	of the City of Houston's governing body for:
8	(1) the issuance of bonds for an improvement project;
9	(2) the plans and specifications of an improvement
10	project financed by the bonds; and
11	(3) the plans and specifications of an improvement
12	project related to the use of land owned by the City of Houston, an
13	easement granted by the City of Houston, or a right-of-way of a
14	street, road, or highway.
15	(b) The approval obtained under Subsection (a) for the
16	issuance of bonds must be a resolution by the City of Houston. The
17	approval obtained under Subsection (a) for plans and specifications
18	must be a permit issued by the City of Houston.
19	(c) If the district obtains the approval of the City of
20	Houston's governing body of a capital improvements budget for a
21	period not to exceed five years, the district may finance the
22	capital improvements and issue bonds specified in the budget
23	without further approval from the City of Houston.
24	Sec. 3849.108. MEMBERSHIP IN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. The
25	district may join and pay dues to an organization that:
26	(1) enjoys tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3),
27	(4), or (6), Internal Revenue Code of 1986; and

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1	(2) performs a service or provides an activity
2	consistent with the furtherance of a district purpose.
3	Sec. 3849.109. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS AND OTHER
4	POWERS RELATED TO PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT. (a) The district may
5	establish and provide for the administration of one or more
6	programs to promote state or local economic development and to
7	stimulate business and commercial activity in the district,
8	including programs to:
9	(1) make loans and grants of public money; and
10	(2) provide district personnel and services.
11	(b) The district has all of the powers of a municipality
12	under Chapter 380, Local Government Code.
13	Sec. 3849.110. NO EMINENT DOMAIN. The district may not
14	exercise the power of eminent domain.
15	[Sections 3849.111-3849.150 reserved for expansion]
16	SUBCHAPTER D. FINANCIAL PROVISIONS
17	Sec. 3849.151. DISBURSEMENTS AND TRANSFERS OF MONEY. The
18	board by resolution shall establish the number of directors'
19	signatures and the procedure required for a disbursement or
20	transfer of the district's money.
21	Sec. 3849.152. MONEY USED FOR IMPROVEMENTS OR SERVICES.
22	The district may acquire, construct, finance, operate, or maintain
23	any improvement or service authorized under this chapter or Chapter
24	375, Local Government Code, using any money available to the
25	<u>district.</u>
26	Sec. 3849.153. PETITION REQUIRED FOR FINANCING SERVICES AND
27	IMPROVEMENTS WITH ASSESSMENTS. (a) The board may not finance a

1 service or improvement project with assessments under this chapter 2 unless a written petition requesting that service or improvement 3 has been filed with the board. 4 (b) The petition must be signed by: 5 (1) the owners of a majority of the assessed value of 6 real property in the district subject to assessment according to 7 the most recent certified tax appraisal roll for Harris County; or (2) at least 50 owners of real property in the 8 9 district, if more than 50 persons own real property in the district 10 according to the most recent certified tax appraisal roll for Harris County. 11 Sec. 3849.154. METHOD OF NOTICE FOR HEARING. (a) 12 The district shall mail the notice required by Section 375.115(c), 13 Local Government Code, by certified or first class United States 14 15 mail. The board shall determine the type of notice required based on whether adequate notice is provided by the method. 16 17 (b) If the district uses first class mail to provide the notice, the district must also publish the notice in a newspaper of 18 general circulation in the district not later than the 20th day 19 before the date of the event for which notice was provided. 20 21 Sec. 3849.155. ASSESSMENTS; LIENS FOR ASSESSMENTS. (a) The board by resolution may impose and collect an assessment for any 22 purpose authorized by this chapter. 23 24 (b) An assessment, a reassessment, or an assessment 25 resulting from an addition to or correction of the assessment roll 26 by the district, penalties and interest on an assessment or reassessment, an expense of collection, and reasonable attorney's 27

1 fees incurred by the district: 2 (1) are a first and prior lien against the property 3 assessed; 4 (2) are superior to any other lien or claim other than 5 a lien or claim for county, school district, or municipal ad valorem 6 taxes; and 7 (3) are the personal liability of and a charge against 8 the owners of the property even if the owners are not named in the 9 assessment proceedings. (c) The lien is effective from the date of the board's 10 resolution imposing the assessment until the date the assessment is 11 12 paid. The board may enforce the lien in the same manner that the board may enforce an ad valorem tax lien against real property. 13 14 (d) The board may make a correction to or deletion from the 15 assessment roll that does not increase the amount of assessment of any parcel of land without providing notice and holding a hearing in 16 17 the manner required for additional assessments. Sec. 3849.156. ASSESSMENTS CONSIDERED TAXES. For purposes 18 19 of a title insurance policy issued under Title 11, Insurance Code, an assessment is a tax. 20 21 Sec. 3849.157. AD VALOREM TAX. (a) If authorized at an election held in accordance with Section 3849.162, the district may 22 impose an annual ad valorem tax on taxable property in the district 23 24 for any district purpose, including to: 25 (1) maintain and operate the district; 26 (2) construct or acquire improvements; or (3) provide a service. 27

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(b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
exceed the rate approved at the election.
Sec. 3849.158. UTILITY PROPERTY EXEMPT FROM IMPACT FEES AND
ASSESSMENTS. The district may not impose an impact fee or
assessment on the property, including the equipment,
rights-of-way, facilities, or improvements, of:
(1) an electric utility or a power generation company
as defined by Section 31.002, Utilities Code;
(2) a gas utility as defined by Section 101.003 or
121.001, Utilities Code;
(3) a telecommunications provider as defined by
Section 51.002, Utilities Code; or
(4) a person who provides to the public cable
television or advanced telecommunications services.
Sec. 3849.159. USE OF ELECTRICAL OR OPTICAL LINES. (a) The
district may impose an assessment to pay the cost of:
(1) burying or removing electrical power lines,
telephone lines, cable or fiber optic lines, or any other type of
electrical or optical line;
(2) removing poles and any elevated lines using the
poles; or
(3) reconnecting the lines described by Subdivision
(2) to the buildings or other improvements to which the lines were
connected.
(b) The district may acquire, operate, or charge fees for
the use of the district conduits for:
(1) another person's:

1	(A) telecommunications network;
2	(B) fiber-optic cable; or
3	(C) electronic transmission line; or
4	(2) any other type of transmission line or supporting
5	facility.
6	(c) The district may not require a person to use a district
7	conduit. This subsection does not diminish or disturb the rights
8	and obligations of an electric utility or a telephone or telegraph
9	corporation under Sections 181.042 and 181.082, Utilities Code.
10	Sec. 3849.160. BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. (a) The
11	district may issue bonds or other obligations payable wholly or
12	partly from taxes, assessments, impact fees, revenue, grants, or
13	other money of the district, or any combination of those sources of
14	money, to pay for any authorized purpose of the district.
15	(b) In exercising the district's power to borrow, the
16	district may issue a bond or other obligation in the form of a bond,
17	note, certificate of participation or other instrument evidencing a
18	proportionate interest in payments to be made by the district, or
19	other type of obligation.
20	Sec. 3849.161. TAXES FOR BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. At
21	the time bonds or other obligations payable wholly or partly from ad
22	valorem taxes are issued:
23	(1) the board shall impose a continuing direct annual
24	ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, for each year
25	that all or part of the bonds are outstanding; and
26	(2) the district annually shall impose the continuing
27	direct ad valorem tax on all taxable property in the district in an

1	amount sufficient to:
2	(A) pay the interest on the bonds or other
3	obligations as the interest becomes due;
4	(B) create a sinking fund for the payment of the
5	principal of the bonds or other obligations when due or the
6	redemption price at any earlier required redemption date; and
7	(C) pay the expenses of imposing the taxes.
8	Sec. 3849.162. TAX AND BOND ELECTIONS. (a) The district
9	shall hold an election in the manner provided by Subchapter L,
10	Chapter 375, Local Government Code, to obtain voter approval before
11	the district imposes an ad valorem tax or issues bonds payable from
12	ad valorem taxes. The proposition for an election approving an ad
13	valorem tax must specify the maximum tax rate authorized.
14	(b) The board may submit multiple purposes in a single
15	proposition at an election.
16	(c) Section 375.243, Local Government Code, does not apply
17	to the district.
18	Sec. 3849.163. CITY OF HOUSTON NOT REQUIRED TO PAY DISTRICT
19	OBLIGATIONS. Except as provided by Section 375.263, Local
20	Government Code, the City of Houston is not required to pay a bond,
21	note, or other obligation of the district.
22	Sec. 3849.164. COMPETITIVE BIDDING. Section 375.221, Local
23	Government Code, applies to the district only for a contract that
24	has a value greater than \$25,000.
25	Sec. 3849.165. TAX AND ASSESSMENT ABATEMENTS. The district
26	may grant in the manner authorized by Chapter 312, Tax Code, an
27	abatement for a tax or assessment owed to the district.

2	SUBCHAPTER E. DISSOLUTION
3	Sec. 3849.201. DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICT WITH OUTSTANDING
4	DEBT. (a) The board may dissolve the district regardless of
5	whether the district has debt. Section 375.264, Local Government
6	Code, does not apply to the district.
7	(b) If the district has debt when it is dissolved, the
8	district shall remain in existence solely for the purpose of
9	discharging its debts. The dissolution is effective when all debts
10	have been discharged.

2 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. The legislature finds 3 that:

4 (1) proper and legal notice of the intention to 5 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 6 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 7 8 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished by 9 the constitution and laws of this state, including the governor, who has submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on 10 Environmental Quality; 11

12 (2) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has 13 filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, 14 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives 15 within the required time;

16 (3) the general law relating to consent by political 17 subdivisions to the creation of districts with conservation, 18 reclamation, and road powers and the inclusion of land in those 19 districts has been complied with; and

(4) all requirements of the constitution and laws of
this state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with
respect to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act have
been fulfilled and accomplished.

24 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 25 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 26 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 27 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for

1 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
