H.B. No. 4005

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the creation of the Research Valley Innovation District.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 4, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 3854 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 3854. RESEARCH VALLEY INNOVATION DISTRICT

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 3854.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

(1) "Board" means the board of directors of the district.

(2) "Commissioners court" means the governing body of Brazos County.

(3) "Director" means a board member.

(4) "District" means the Research Valley Innovation District.

(5) "Obligation" means an interest-bearing obligation issued by the district under this chapter, including a bond, certificate, note, or other evidence of indebtedness.

(6) "Project" means a project established under Section 3854.111 and includes the land, buildings, equipment, facilities, infrastructure, improvements, and other property necessary to accomplish the purposes of the project.

Sec. 3854.002. PURPOSE; DECLARATION OF LEGISLATIVE

1 FINDINGS. (a) The creation of the district is essential to
2 accomplish the purposes of Section 52-a, Article III, and Section
3 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and to accomplish other public
4 purposes stated in this chapter.

5 (b) This chapter is enabling legislation enacted to further
6 the public purposes under Section 52-a, Article III, Texas
7 Constitution.

8 (c) The creation of the district is necessary to further the
9 public purpose of improving the economy of this state and of Brazos
10 County by providing for projects.

11 (d) The district serves the public purposes stated in this
12 section.

13 Sec. 3854.003. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a
14 special district and a political subdivision of this state under
15 Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

16 Sec. 3854.004. DISTRICT TERRITORY. The district boundaries
17 are coextensive with the boundaries of Brazos County.

18 Sec. 3854.005. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER WATER DISTRICTS LAW.
19 Chapter 49, Water Code, does not apply to the district.

20 Sec. 3854.006. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This
21 chapter shall be construed liberally in conformity with the
22 legislative findings and purposes stated in this chapter.

23 [Sections 3854.007-3854.050 reserved for expansion]

24 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

25 Sec. 3854.051. GOVERNING BODY. The district is governed by
26 a board of seven directors appointed as provided by this
27 subchapter.

1 Sec. 3854.052. TERMS. (a) Directors serve staggered
2 three-year terms that expire on June 1.

3 (b) A director may not serve more than two consecutive
4 terms.

5 Sec. 3854.053. APPOINTMENT. The commissioners court shall
6 appoint the directors.

7 Sec. 3854.054. QUALIFICATIONS. A director:

8 (1) must be a registered voter of Brazos County; and

9 (2) may not:

10 (A) be an elected official; or

11 (B) be employed by the district or Brazos County.

12 Sec. 3854.055. VACANCY. The remaining directors shall fill
13 a vacancy in the office of director for the unexpired term.

14 Sec. 3854.056. DIRECTOR'S BOND; OATH OR AFFIRMATION. (a)
15 As soon as practicable after a director is appointed, the director
16 shall execute a bond for \$10,000 payable to the district and
17 conditioned on the faithful performance of the director's duties.

18 (b) The bond must be approved by the board.

19 (c) The bond and the director's constitutional oath or
20 affirmation of office shall be filed with the district and the
21 district shall retain the bond and the oath or affirmation in the
22 district's records.

23 Sec. 3854.057. OFFICERS. (a) The board shall elect from
24 among the directors a presiding officer, a secretary, and any other
25 officers the board considers necessary.

26 (b) The board by resolution shall establish the powers and
27 duties of the officers, consistent with this chapter.

1 Sec. 3854.058. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. A director serves
2 without compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for actual
3 and necessary expenses approved by the board.

4 Sec. 3854.059. MEETINGS; NOTICE OF MEETINGS. (a) The board
5 may establish regular meetings to conduct district business and may
6 hold special meetings at other times as necessary.

7 (b) The board shall provide the notice prepared under
8 Subchapter C, Chapter 551, Government Code, to the county clerk of
9 Brazos County. In addition to the requirements imposed by that
10 subchapter on the district, the county shall post the notice at the
11 usual location at which notices of commissioners court meetings are
12 posted.

13 Sec. 3854.060. EMPLOYEES; PERSONS HIRED BY BOARD. (a) The
14 board shall employ any person the board considers necessary to
15 conduct district affairs, including:

- 16 (1) engineers;
- 17 (2) attorneys;
- 18 (3) certified public accountants;
- 19 (4) economists;
- 20 (5) administrative assistants;
- 21 (6) bookkeepers; and
- 22 (7) clerical workers.

23 (b) The board by resolution shall determine the
24 compensation and terms of service of any person employed or hired by
25 the district.

26 (c) The board may remove any employee.

27 (d) The board may require an employee to execute a bond

1 payable to the district and conditioned on the faithful performance
2 of the person's duties.

3 Sec. 3854.061. INITIAL DIRECTORS. (a) After creation of
4 the district under Subchapter F, the commissioners court shall by
5 resolution appoint initial directors.

6 (b) The commissioners court shall stagger the directors'
7 terms to expire on June 1, with:

8 (1) two directors serving as near as possible to a
9 one-year term;

10 (2) two directors serving as near as possible to a
11 two-year term; and

12 (3) three directors serving as near as possible to a
13 three-year term.

14 [Sections 3854.062-3854.100 reserved for expansion]

15 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

16 Sec. 3854.101. GENERAL POWERS. The district has all powers
17 necessary or convenient to carry out and effect the purposes and
18 provisions of this chapter.

19 Sec. 3854.102. RULES. The board may adopt rules to govern
20 the district, including rules governing district operations,
21 employees, and property.

22 Sec. 3854.103. DISTRICT OFFICE. The board shall designate
23 and establish a district office in Brazos County.

24 Sec. 3854.104. PROPERTY. The district may exercise any
25 type of property right, including the power to acquire, sell, or
26 lease as lessee or lessor, regarding any type of property interest
27 in the district or for use in the district under terms determined by

1 the board.

2 Sec. 3854.105. AGREEMENTS. The district may make an
3 agreement with any person for any district purpose, including a
4 contract to manage or maintain a district project.

5 Sec. 3854.106. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND LOANS. The district may
6 accept a gift, grant, or loan from any person for any district
7 purpose.

8 Sec. 3854.107. COMPETITIVE BIDDING. (a) Except as
9 provided by Subsection (b), Section 375.221, Local Government Code,
10 applies to the district.

11 (b) Section 375.221, Local Government Code, does not apply
12 to a contract between the district and:

13 (1) another governmental entity;

14 (2) a nonprofit corporation, including a scientific
15 research corporation; or

16 (3) a corporation created under the Development
17 Corporation Act of 1979.

18 Sec. 3854.108. RELATION TO OTHER LAW ON CONTRACTS. This
19 chapter states the procedures necessary to award contracts and
20 supersedes any law or other requirement otherwise applicable to the
21 district regarding the award of contracts.

22 Sec. 3854.109. FEES FOR USE OF DISTRICT IMPROVEMENTS. The
23 district may establish and maintain reasonable and
24 nondiscriminatory rates, fares, charges, rents, or other fees or
25 compensation for the use of the improvements constructed, operated,
26 or maintained by the district.

27 Sec. 3854.110. PROGRAMS. (a) The district may establish

1 and provide for the administration of one or more programs to:

2 (1) promote state or local economic development;

3 (2) stimulate business and commercial activity in the
4 district that relates to a project; and

5 (3) provide workforce development and vocational
6 training activities in partnership with Blinn College and other
7 educational institutions as necessary to support the skills
8 development vocational training needs in the district.

9 (b) As part of a program, the district may make loans or
10 grants of public money for a public purpose as provided by Section
11 52-a, Article III, Texas Constitution.

12 Sec. 3854.111. PROJECTS. (a) The district may establish
13 projects for:

14 (1) education provided in affiliation with an
15 institution of higher education, including job training or
16 vocational education;

17 (2) promotion and support of economic development
18 opportunities at Texas A&M University at College Station and Texas
19 A&M University Health Science Center;

20 (3) research and development activities, including
21 initiatives to prove the feasibility of an idea;

22 (4) commercialization of the results of research;

23 (5) the incubation of new business or the expansion of
24 existing business;

25 (6) the promotion of innovations or discoveries;

26 (7) the production and manufacturing of goods and
27 products; and

1 (8) day-to-day business operations or services.

2 (b) A project must be related to the following areas of
3 technology or industry:

4 (1) energy, including manufactured energy systems or
5 the development of alternative energy sources;

6 (2) biotechnology;

7 (3) medicine or pharmaceuticals;

8 (4) life sciences;

9 (5) defense or homeland security;

10 (6) information, computer, or software technology,
11 including semiconductor technology;

12 (7) engineering; or

13 (8) micro-electromechanical systems.

14 Sec. 3854.112. SUITS. (a) The district may sue and be
15 sued.

16 (b) Service of process in a suit may be made by serving any
17 two directors.

18 (c) The district may not be required to give security for
19 costs and may appeal from a judgment without giving a supersedeas
20 bond or cost bond.

21 Sec. 3854.113. SEAL. The district may adopt a seal.

22 Sec. 3854.114. NONPROFIT CORPORATION; JOINT ECONOMIC
23 DEVELOPMENT. The district shall contract with:

24 (1) a nonprofit corporation that receives money from
25 Brazos County and the cities of Bryan and College Station to promote
26 joint economic development for those governmental entities; or

27 (2) another entity associated or affiliated with the

1 nonprofit corporation to initiate, promote, facilitate, or
2 administer the development of, or to serve or assist the district to
3 implement, a project or program under this chapter.

4 [Sections 3854.115-3854.150 reserved for expansion]

5 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

6 Sec. 3854.151. USE OF DISTRICT MONEY. The district may use
7 district money for any district purpose, including:

8 (1) to pay for projects; and

9 (2) to pay district obligations.

10 Sec. 3854.152. INVESTMENTS. (a) The district may invest
11 money the district receives under this chapter.

12 (b) The district may hire a person to invest district money
13 on terms the board considers advisable.

14 Sec. 3854.153. DISBURSEMENTS OR TRANSFERS OF MONEY. The
15 board by resolution shall establish the number of directors'
16 signatures and the procedure required for a disbursement or
17 transfer of district money.

18 Sec. 3854.154. DEPOSITORY INSTITUTION. The district may
19 select one or more financial institutions to serve as a depository
20 bank for the district.

21 Sec. 3854.155. ACCOUNTS; FISCAL YEAR. (a) The district may
22 establish an accounting system for the district for each year.

23 (b) The district may establish a fiscal year for the
24 district.

25 Sec. 3854.156. PROJECT FUND. (a) The district by
26 resolution shall establish a project fund.

27 (b) The district may establish separate accounts in the

1 project fund.

2 (c) The district shall deposit into the project fund all
3 money acquired or received by the district, including:

4 (1) the proceeds from an ad valorem tax imposed by the
5 district; and

6 (2) revenue from the sale of district obligations.

7 Sec. 3854.157. AUDIT. (a) The district shall enter into a
8 written contract with an independent certified public accountant or
9 a certified public accounting firm for an annual audit of the
10 district's affairs and financial records.

11 (b) The district shall make the audit available for
12 inspection by the public and Brazos County.

13 Sec. 3854.158. ASSESSMENTS. The district may impose an
14 assessment on property in the district, including an assessment on
15 a leasehold interest, by agreement with the property owner.

16 Sec. 3854.159. LIABILITIES. The district may incur
17 liabilities, including a liability incurred by:

18 (1) borrowing money on terms the board determines; and

19 (2) issuing obligations under Section 3854.160.

20 Sec. 3854.160. OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may issue
21 obligations, including revenue bonds, to pay the costs of a project
22 in the district.

23 (b) The district may issue an obligation in the form of a
24 bond, note, certificate of participation or other instrument
25 evidencing a proportionate interest in payments to be made by the
26 district, or other type of obligation.

27 [Sections 3854.161-3854.200 reserved for expansion]

1 SUBCHAPTER E. AD VALOREM TAX

2 Sec. 3854.201. IMPOSITION OF AD VALOREM TAX. If authorized
3 at an election held under Subchapter F, the district:

4 (1) may by order impose an annual ad valorem tax on
5 taxable property in the district to pay for projects; and

6 (2) shall by order impose an ad valorem tax to pay for
7 obligations that are payable wholly or partly from ad valorem
8 taxes.

9 Sec. 3854.202. TAX RATE. (a) The board shall recommend a
10 tax rate to the commissioners court.

11 (b) The commissioners court shall set the tax rate. The tax
12 rate may not exceed 10 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation of
13 taxable property in the district.

14 Sec. 3854.203. TAX ASSESSOR-COLLECTOR. The board may:

15 (1) appoint a district tax assessor-collector; or

16 (2) contract for the assessment and collection of
17 taxes as provided by the Tax Code.

18 [Sections 3854.204-3854.250 reserved for expansion]

19 SUBCHAPTER F. PETITION AND ELECTION TO ALLOW CREATION, TAXING, OR
20 RELATED OBLIGATION AUTHORITY

21 Sec. 3854.251. APPLICATION FOR PETITION TO CREATE DISTRICT.

22 (a) If 10 or more registered voters of Brazos County file a written
23 application with the county, the county shall issue to the
24 applicants a petition to be circulated among the registered voters
25 of the county for the signatures of voters who want an election to
26 be called in the county to determine whether to create the district:

27 (1) with the power to impose an ad valorem tax not to

1 exceed 10 cents per \$100 valuation of all taxable property in the
2 district; or

3 (2) without the power to impose an ad valorem tax.

4 (b) An application for a petition to create the district
5 with the power to impose an ad valorem tax must be entitled:
6 "Application for Local Option Election Petition to Create the
7 Research Valley Innovation District with the Power to Impose an Ad
8 Valorem Tax not to Exceed 10 Cents per \$100 Valuation of all Taxable
9 Property in the District." The application must contain a
10 statement immediately above the signatures of the applicants that
11 reads substantially as follows: "The petitioners whose signatures
12 appear on this petition intend that the Research Valley Innovation
13 District referred to in the issue set out above be created." If the
14 petition also seeks an election to authorize the issuance of bonds
15 by the district payable in whole or in part from ad valorem taxes,
16 the following statement must be appended to the end of the title
17 specified in this subsection: "and to Issue Bonds Payable in Whole
18 or in Part from the Ad Valorem Tax."

19 (c) An application for a petition under this section to
20 create the district without the power to impose the ad valorem tax
21 must be entitled: "Application for Local Option Election Petition
22 to Create the Research Valley Innovation District." The
23 application must contain a statement immediately above the
24 signatures of the applicants that reads substantially as follows:
25 "The petitioners whose signatures appear on this petition intend
26 that the Research Valley Innovation District referred to in the
27 issue set out above be created."

1 Sec. 3854.252. APPLICATION FOR PETITION TO CALL TAX OR BOND
2 ELECTION. (a) If the district is created without the power to
3 impose an ad valorem tax and 10 or more registered voters of Brazos
4 County file a written application with the county for a petition to
5 authorize the district to impose an ad valorem tax, the county shall
6 issue to the applicants a petition to be circulated among the
7 registered voters of the county for the signatures of voters who
8 want to authorize the district to impose an ad valorem tax.

9 (b) At the request of petitioners under this section, a
10 petition for a local option election to determine whether the
11 district may impose an ad valorem tax may also provide that at the
12 same election the district is authorized to issue obligations
13 payable wholly or partly from that ad valorem tax as permitted under
14 Section 3854.160.

15 (c) The application for the petition must be titled:
16 "Application for Local Option Election Petition to Enable the
17 Research Valley Innovation District to Impose an Ad Valorem Tax not
18 to Exceed 10 Cents per \$100 Valuation of all Taxable Property in the
19 District."

20 (d) The application must contain a statement immediately
21 above the signatures of the applicants that reads substantially as
22 follows: "The petitioners whose signatures appear on this petition
23 intend that the Research Valley Innovation District be enabled to
24 impose an ad valorem tax not to exceed 10 cents per \$100 valuation
25 of all taxable property in the district."

26 (e) If the petition also seeks an election to authorize the
27 issuance of obligations by the district payable wholly or partly

1 from ad valorem taxes, the following statement must be appended to
2 the title specified by Subsection (c): "and to Issue Bonds Payable
3 in Whole or in Part from the Ad Valorem Tax."

4 Sec. 3854.253. FORM AND COPIES OF PETITION. (a) Each
5 petition issued under this subchapter must show the date it is
6 issued by Brazos County and be serially numbered. Each page of the
7 petition must bear the same date and serial number.

8 (b) Brazos County shall supply as many copies of the
9 petition as required by the applicants but not to exceed more than
10 one page of the petition for every 10 registered voters in the
11 county. Each copy shall bear the date, number, and seal on each
12 page as required on the original petition.

13 (c) Brazos County shall keep a copy of each petition and a
14 record of the applicants for that petition.

15 Sec. 3854.254. FILING AND VERIFICATION OF PETITION. (a)
16 The applicants requesting a petition under this subchapter may file
17 a request with Brazos County for the petition to be verified. The
18 applicants must file the request not later than the 120th day after
19 the date the petition is issued by the county.

20 (b) If the applicants file a request for verification of the
21 petition, Brazos County shall examine the names of the signers of
22 petitions and determine whether the signers of the petition were
23 registered voters of the county at the time the petition was issued.

24 (c) Brazos County shall certify to the commissioners court
25 the number of registered voters signing the petition not later than
26 the 15th day after the date the request for verification was filed.

27 (d) A signature may not be counted under this section if

1 there is good reason to believe that:

2 (1) the signature is not the actual signature of the
3 purported signer;

4 (2) the voter registration certificate number is not
5 correct;

6 (3) the signature duplicates a name or the handwriting
7 used in any other signature on the petition; or

8 (4) the signer's residence address cannot be verified.

9 Sec. 3854.255. ELECTION ORDER. (a) Not later than the
10 date of the fourth regular session of the commissioners court
11 convened after a petition has been verified under Section 3854.254,
12 the commissioners court shall order an election to be held in the
13 district on the proposition stated in the petition if the petition
14 contains:

15 (1) the signatures of a number of registered voters of
16 Brazos County equal to at least 10 percent of the registered voters
17 of the county who voted in the most recent general election in the
18 county;

19 (2) a notation showing the residence address of each
20 signer;

21 (3) each signer's voter registration certificate
22 number; and

23 (4) each signer's printed name.

24 (b) The following shall be entered in the commissioners
25 court minutes:

26 (1) the dates a petition is presented to and verified
27 by Brazos County;

1 (2) the names of the signers; and

2 (3) the action taken on the petition.

3 (c) The order issued under Subsection (a) must state that
4 the district's boundaries are coextensive with the boundaries of
5 Brazos County and that the election will be held within those
6 boundaries.

7 Sec. 3854.256. NOTICE AND CONDUCT OF ELECTION;
8 RESULTS. (a) The commissioners court shall give notice of an
9 election ordered under Section 3854.255 by publishing a substantial
10 copy of the election order once a week for two consecutive weeks in
11 a newspaper with general circulation in Brazos County.

12 (b) The first publication of the notice must appear before
13 the 14th day before the date set for the election. If the election
14 order includes the issue of whether the district may issue
15 obligations, the first publication of the notice must appear before
16 the 31st day before the date set for the election.

17 (c) The ballot for an election held under this section must
18 be printed to permit voting for or against the following
19 proposition, as appropriate according to the verified petition:

20 (1) "Authorizing the creation of the Research Valley
21 Innovation District and the imposition of an ad valorem tax not to
22 exceed the rate of 10 cents per \$100 valuation of all taxable
23 property in the district.";

24 (2) "Authorizing the creation of the Research Valley
25 Innovation District, the imposition of an ad valorem tax not to
26 exceed the rate of 10 cents per \$100 valuation of all taxable
27 property in the district, and the issuance of bonds payable in whole

1 or in part from the ad valorem tax.";

2 (3) "Authorizing the creation of the Research Valley
3 Innovation District.";

4 (4) "Authorizing the imposition of an ad valorem tax
5 not to exceed the rate of 10 cents per \$100 valuation of all taxable
6 property in the district."; or

7 (5) "Authorizing the imposition of an ad valorem tax
8 not to exceed the rate of 10 cents per \$100 valuation of all taxable
9 property in the district and the issuance of bonds payable wholly or
10 partly from the ad valorem tax."

11 (d) The district is created if a majority of the voters
12 voting at the election favor creation.

13 (e) The district may impose an ad valorem tax if a majority
14 of the district voters voting at the election favor the proposition
15 stated in Subsection (c)(1), (2), (4), or (5).

16 (f) The district may issue obligations payable wholly or
17 partly from ad valorem taxes if a majority of the district voters
18 voting at the election favor the proposition stated in Subsection
19 (c)(2) or (5).

20 (g) If a majority of the district voters voting at the
21 election vote against the proposition, another election on the
22 proposition may not be held before the first anniversary of the date
23 of the most recent election concerning the proposition.

24 (h) Brazos County shall hold an election provided under this
25 section on the earliest uniform election date under Section 41.001,
26 Election Code, that occurs after the commissioners court adopts the
27 order calling the election.

1 [Sections 3854.257-3854.300 reserved for expansion]

2 SUBCHAPTER G. DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICT

3 Sec. 3854.301. DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICT. The district may
4 be dissolved only as provided by this subchapter.

5 Sec. 3854.302. DISSOLUTION BY ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS COURT.

6 (a) The board may petition the commissioners court to dissolve the
7 district if the board finds that the district:

8 (1) has not issued obligations under Section 3854.160
9 and that the purposes of the district are impracticable, or
10 reasonably and economically cannot be successful or accomplished;
11 or

12 (2) has paid, or otherwise provided for payment of,
13 all obligations issued under Section 3854.160 and that the district
14 purposes have been accomplished.

15 (b) On receipt of the petition, the commissioners court
16 shall hold a public hearing to determine whether the dissolution of
17 the district serves the best interests of Brazos County and of the
18 residents of the county.

19 (c) After the hearing, the commissioners court shall:

20 (1) enter in the commissioners court records the
21 appropriate findings and an order dissolving the district if the
22 commissioners court unanimously determines that the best interests
23 of Brazos County and of the residents of the county will be served
24 by dissolving the district; or

25 (2) enter an order providing that the district is not
26 dissolved if the commissioners court does not unanimously determine
27 that the best interests of Brazos County and of the residents of the

1 county will be served by dissolving the district.

2 (d) On dissolution of the district under this section:

3 (1) all money and other property of the district are
4 transferred to Brazos County; and

5 (2) Brazos County shall assume any remaining district
6 contracts or other district obligations.

7 Sec. 3854.303. DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICT ON AGREEMENT WITH
8 BRAZOS COUNTY. (a) The district may be dissolved by agreement
9 between the commissioners court and the board.

10 (b) On dissolution of the district under this section:

11 (1) all money and other property of the district are
12 transferred to Brazos County; and

13 (2) Brazos County shall assume the district's
14 responsibilities regarding all district contracts, debts, and
15 obligations.

16 Sec. 3854.304. EFFECT OF DISSOLUTION ON TAXES. On
17 dissolution of the district, any taxes imposed by the district are
18 abolished.

19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
23 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
