H.B. No. 4099

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the creation of the Preston Summit Municipal Utility District No. 1 of Grayson County; providing authority to impose a tax and issue bonds; granting the power of eminent domain.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 8254 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 8254. PRESTON SUMMIT MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 1 OF
GRAYSON COUNTY

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 8254.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

(1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.

(2) "Director" means a board member.

(3) "District" means the Preston Summit Municipal Utility District No. 1 of Grayson County.

Sec. 8254.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a municipal utility district in Grayson County created under and essential to accomplish the purposes of Section 52, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

Sec. 8254.003. CONFIRMATION ELECTION REQUIRED. If the creation of the district is not confirmed at a confirmation election held under Section 8254.023 before September 1, 2011:

(1) the district is dissolved September 1, 2011, except that the district shall:

- 1 (A) pay any debts incurred;
2 (B) transfer to Grayson County any assets that
3 remain after the payment of debts; and
4 (C) maintain the organization of the district
5 until all debts are paid and remaining assets are transferred; and
6 (2) this chapter expires September 1, 2014.

7 Sec. 8254.004. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The
8 district is initially composed of the territory described by
9 Section 2 of the Act creating this chapter.

10 (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of
11 the Act creating this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the
12 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process
13 does not affect:

14 (1) the organization, existence, or validity of the
15 district;

16 (2) the right of the district to impose taxes;

17 (3) the validity of the district's bonds, notes, or
18 indebtedness; or

19 (4) the legality or operation of the district or the
20 board.

22 SUBCHAPTER A-1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONS

23 Sec. 8254.021. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or after
24 September 1, 2007, a person who owns land in the district may submit
25 a petition to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
26 requesting that the commission appoint as temporary directors the
27 five persons named in the petition.

1 (b) The commission shall appoint as temporary directors the
2 five persons named in the first petition received by the commission
3 under Subsection (a).

4 (c) If a temporary director fails to qualify for office, the
5 commission shall appoint a person to fill the vacancy.

6 (d) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:

7 (1) the date directors are elected under Section
8 8254.023; or

9 (2) the date this chapter expires under Section
10 8254.003.

11 Sec. 8254.022. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF TEMPORARY
12 DIRECTORS. As soon as practicable after all the temporary
13 directors have qualified under Section 49.055, Water Code, the
14 temporary directors shall meet at a location in the district
15 agreeable to a majority of the directors. At the meeting, the
16 temporary directors shall elect officers from among the temporary
17 directors and conduct any other district business.

18 Sec. 8254.023. CONFIRMATION AND INITIAL DIRECTORS'
19 ELECTION; ANNEXATION BY CITY. (a) The temporary directors shall
20 hold an election to confirm the creation of the district and to
21 elect five directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.

22 (b) The temporary directors may not hold the election until
23 the City of Gunter has annexed into its corporate limits all
24 territory described by Section 2 of the Act creating this chapter.

25 Sec. 8254.024. INITIAL ELECTED DIRECTORS; TERMS. The
26 directors elected under Section 8254.023 shall draw lots to
27 determine which two shall serve until the first regularly scheduled

1 election of directors and which three shall serve until the second
2 regularly scheduled election of directors.

3 Sec. 8254.025. EXPIRATION OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
4 expires September 1, 2014.

5 [Sections 8254.026-8254.050 reserved for expansion]

6 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

7 Sec. 8254.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is
8 governed by a board of five directors.

9 (b) Directors serve staggered four-year terms.

10 [Sections 8254.052-8254.100 reserved for expansion]

11 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

12 Sec. 8254.101. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND
13 DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided by the
14 general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code,
15 applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59,
16 Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

17 Sec. 8254.102. ROAD PROJECTS. (a) To the extent authorized
18 by Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may
19 construct, acquire, improve, maintain, or operate macadamized,
20 graveled, or paved roads or turnpikes, or improvements in aid of
21 those roads or turnpikes, inside the district.

22 (b) A road project must meet all applicable construction
23 standards, zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of
24 each municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial
25 jurisdiction the district is located.

26 (c) The district may not undertake a road project unless
27 each municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial

1 jurisdiction the district is located consents by resolution.

2 Sec. 8254.103. DIVISION OF DISTRICT. (a) The district may
3 be divided into two new districts only if the district:

4 (1) has no outstanding bonded debt; and

5 (2) is not imposing ad valorem taxes.

6 (b) The division procedure is prescribed by Sections 53.030
7 through 53.041, Water Code.

8 (c) Any new district created by the division of the district
9 has all the powers and duties of the district.

10 (d) Any new district created by the division of the district
11 may not, at the time the new district is created, contain any land:

12 (1) outside the area described by Section 2 of the Act
13 creating this chapter; or

14 (2) outside the corporate limits of the city of
15 Gunter.

16 Sec. 8254.104. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT
17 RESOLUTIONS. The district shall comply with all applicable
18 requirements of any ordinance or resolution adopted by the
19 governing body of each municipality in whose corporate limits or
20 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located.

21 Sec. 8254.105. LIMITATION ON ANNEXATION. (a) The district
22 may not add land to the district under Subchapter J, Chapter 49,
23 Water Code, if the land is located outside the corporate limits of
24 the city of Gunter.

25 (b) Section 43.075, Local Government Code, does not apply to
26 the district.

1 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

2 Sec. 8254.151. TAX TO REPAY BONDS. The district may impose
3 a tax to pay the principal of or interest on bonds or other
4 obligations issued under Section 8254.201.

5 [Sections 8254.152-8254.200 reserved for expansion]

6 SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS

7 Sec. 8254.201. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER
8 OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may issue bonds or other obligations
9 as provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, to finance the
10 construction, maintenance, or operation of a project under Section
11 8254.101 or 8254.102.

12 (b) The district may not issue bonds or other obligations to
13 finance projects authorized by Section 8254.102 unless the issuance
14 is approved by a vote of a two-thirds majority of the district
15 voters voting at an election held for that purpose.

16 (c) Bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance
17 projects authorized by Section 8254.102 may not exceed one-fourth
18 of the assessed value of the real property in the district.

19 SECTION 2. The Preston Summit Municipal Utility District
20 No. 1 of Grayson County includes all the territory contained in the
21 following area:

16 to a 5/8 inch rebar found in concrete, at the Southeast base of a
17 crosstie corner post, at the Southeast corner of said Wildman
18 183.689 ac. and the Southwest corner of the Phillip Sherwood
19 Wildman and wife, Teresa Marie "Donohoe" Wildman 240.811 ac.
20 (Exhibit "A") in Vol. 2583, Pg. 538, O.P.R.G.C.T.;

21 THENCE South 87 deg. 56 min. 05 sec. East, with the "scattered"
22 remains of an old fence, continuing with said South line of the Thom
23 Survey and said North line of the Johnson Survey, a distance of
24 2665.50 ft. to a spike nail found near the West base of a corner
25 post, in the center of an old "North-South" public road, now
26 abandoned, in the West line of both the Mary Miller Survey, Abstract
27 No. 775 and the Jack A. Turpin 233.480 ac. (Tract No. 1) in Vol.

1 1963, Pg. 436. R.P.R.G.C.T., at the Southeast corner of both the
2 Thom Survey and the Wildman 240.811 ac., the Northeast corner of
3 both the Johnson Survey and the Christie 709.93648 ac.;

4 THENCE South 00 deg. 12 min. 02 sec. East, with the general course
5 of a wire fence along the center of said abandoned road, with said
6 West line of the Miller Survey and the East line of said Johnson
7 Survey, a distance of 1331.48 ft. to an 8 inch wood post maintaining
8 an angle point in the west line of said Turpin 233.480 ac.;

9 THENCE South 17 deg. 23 min.. 18 sec. East, with a wire fence
10 maintaining the West line of said Turpin 233.480 ac., but not with
11 said Miller & Johnson Survey lines and not with the center of said
12 abandoned road, a distance of 301.70 ft. to an 8 inch wood post

5 base of a corner post, at the Southwest corner of said Miller
6 Survey, the most Western Southwest corner of said Trapp 278.389ac.
7 and the Northwest corner of both said Daniel Lloyd Survey and the
8 Christie 68.3 ac.;

9 THENCE North 89 deg. 30 min. 05 sec. East, with the general course
10 of a wire fence maintaining a South line of said Miller Survey and
11 the North line of both said Lloyd Survey and the Christie 68.3 ac.,
12 leaving said abandoned road at 17 ft., and continuing with said
13 fence, for a total distance 914.48 ft. to a 1/2 inch rebar found at
14 the base of a corner post, in the West right-of-way line of State
15 Hwy. 289, at the most Eastern Northeast corner of the herein
16 described tract;

17 THENCE Southwesterly, with the West right-of-way line of State Hwy.

14 found at the base of a corner post;

15 THENCE North 89 deg. 36 min. 08 sec. East, with said South line of
16 the Trapp 278.389 ac. and with said Survey lines, passing said rebar
17 at 2.1 ft., and continuing now with a wire fence, for a total
18 distance of 155.34 ft. to a 1/2 inch rebar found at the base of a

25 Francisco & Texas (Frisco) Railroad, at the Southeast corner of the

27 THENCE South 76 deg. 48 min. 15 sec. West with the North

1 right-of-way line of said Frisco Railroad, a distance of 316.39 ft.
2 to a concrete & brass monument found in said East right-of-way line
3 of State Hwy. 289, at the Southwest corner of the herein described
4 tract;

5 THENCE North 10 deg. 41 min. 06 sec. East, with the East
6 right-of-way line of State Hwy. 289, a distance of 812.53 ft. to the
7 PLACE OF BEGINNING and containing 3.995 ACRES of land.

8 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
9 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
10 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
11 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
12 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
13 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
14 Government Code.

15 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
16 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
17 Environmental Quality.

18 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
19 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
20 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
21 representatives within the required time.

22 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
23 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
24 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
25 and accomplished.

26 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
