H.B. No. 4138

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the creation of The Lakes Municipal Utility and Management District of Tarrant County; providing the authority to issue bonds and impose taxes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 4, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 3855 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 3855. THE LAKES MUNICIPAL UTILITY AND MANAGEMENT DISTRICT

OF TARRANT COUNTY

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 3855.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

(1) "Board" means the board of directors of the district.

(2) "City" means the City of Arlington, located in Tarrant County.

(3) "District" means The Lakes Municipal Utility and Management District of Tarrant County.

(4) "Improvement project" means any program or project authorized by Section 3855.055, inside or outside the boundaries of the district, that is determined by the board to be necessary to accomplish the public purposes of the district.

Sec. 3855.002. CREATION AND NATURE OF DISTRICT. (a) The Lakes Municipal Utility and Management District of Tarrant County is a special district created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

(b) The board by resolution may change the district's name.

1 The board shall give written notice of such change and the new name  
2 to the city.

3 Sec. 3855.003. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This  
4 chapter shall be liberally construed in conformity with the  
5 findings and purposes stated in this chapter.

6 Sec. 3855.004. RELATION TO OTHER LAW. If any provision of  
7 the general law, including a provision incorporated by reference in  
8 this chapter, is in conflict or inconsistent with this chapter,  
9 this chapter prevails.

10 Sec. 3855.005. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The  
11 district is initially composed of the territory described by  
12 Section 2 of the Act creating this chapter.

13 (b) A mistake made in the field notes or in copying the field  
14 notes in the legislative process does not affect:

15 (1) the organization, existence, or validity of the  
16 district;

17 (2) the right and power of the district to impose and  
18 collect ad valorem taxes, to levy, collect, and enforce  
19 assessments, and to impose fees and collect other revenues  
20 authorized by this chapter;

21 (3) the right or power of the board to enter into any  
22 type of contract, including the issuance of bonds or other  
23 obligations, for the purposes for which the district is created; or

24 (4) the legality or operations of the board.

25 Sec. 3855.006. ADDITION OR REMOVAL OF TERRITORY. The board  
26 may add, delete, or exclude territory in the manner provided by  
27 Subchapter J, Chapter 49, Water Code, as limited by Section 54.016,

1 Water Code, except that:

2 (1) land may not be added to or excluded from the  
3 district without the consent of the governing body of the city and  
4 the owners of the land being added or excluded;

5 (2) for purposes of this section, a reference in  
6 Subchapter J, Chapter 49, Water Code, or Section 54.016, Water  
7 Code, to a tax means an ad valorem tax; and

8 (3) land may not be removed or disannexed from the  
9 district at any time during which any bonds or other obligations of  
10 the district that are payable, in whole or in part, from ad valorem  
11 taxes on the land are outstanding.

12 Sec. 3855.007. PURPOSE; DECLARATION OF INTENT. (a) The  
13 creation of the district is essential to accomplish the purposes of  
14 Sections 52 and 52-a, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI,  
15 Texas Constitution, and other public purposes stated in this  
16 chapter. By creating the district and in authorizing the city and  
17 other political subdivisions to contract with the district, the  
18 legislature has established a program to accomplish the public  
19 purposes set out in Section 52-a, Article III, Texas Constitution.

20 (b) The creation of the district is necessary to promote,  
21 develop, encourage, and maintain employment, commerce,  
22 transportation, housing, tourism, recreation, the arts,  
23 entertainment, economic development, safety, and the public  
24 welfare in the district.

25 (c) This chapter and the creation of the district may not be  
26 interpreted to relieve the city or Tarrant County from providing  
27 the level of services provided as of the effective date of the Act

1 enacting this chapter to the area in the district. The district is  
2 created to supplement and not to supplant the county or city  
3 services provided in the district.

4 Sec. 3855.008. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE.

5 (a) The district is created to serve a public use and benefit.

6 (b) All land and other property included in the district  
7 will benefit from the improvement projects and services to be  
8 provided by the district under powers conferred by Sections 52 and  
9 52-a, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas  
10 Constitution, and other powers granted under this chapter.

11 (c) The creation of the district is in the public interest  
12 and is essential to further the public purposes of:

13 (1) developing and diversifying the economy of the  
14 state;

15 (2) elimination of unemployment and underemployment;

16 (3) providing quality residential housing; and

17 (4) developing or expanding transportation and  
18 commerce.

19 (d) The district will:

20 (1) promote the health, safety, and general welfare of  
21 residents, employers, potential employees, employees, visitors,  
22 and consumers in the district, and of the public;

23 (2) provide needed funding for the district to  
24 preserve, maintain, and enhance the economic health and vitality of  
25 the district as a residential community and business center; and

26 (3) promote the health, safety, welfare, and enjoyment  
27 of the public by providing pedestrian ways and by landscaping and

1 developing certain areas in the district, which are necessary for  
2 the restoration, preservation, and enhancement of scenic beauty.

3 (e) Pedestrian ways along or across a street, whether at  
4 grade or above or below the surface, and street lighting, street  
5 landscaping, and street art objects are parts of and necessary  
6 components of a street and are considered to be improvement  
7 projects that include street or road improvements.

8 (f) The district will not act as the agent or  
9 instrumentality of any private interest even though the district  
10 will benefit many private interests as well as the public.

11 [Sections 3855.009–3855.050 reserved for expansion]

12 SUBCHAPTER B. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES

13 Sec. 3855.051. APPLICABLE RIGHTS AND LAWS. (a) Except as  
14 otherwise provided by this chapter, the district has all of the  
15 powers and duties:

16 (1) provided by the general laws relating to:

17 (A) conservation and reclamation districts  
18 created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution,  
19 including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, except that the  
20 district's bonds and other securities are not subject to the  
21 jurisdiction or supervision of the Texas Commission on  
22 Environmental Quality under Chapter 49, Water Code, or other law,  
23 and Section 49.102, Water Code, does not apply to the district; and

24 (B) road districts created under Section 52(b),  
25 Article III, Texas Constitution;

26 (2) of a district under Subchapters A, E, and F,  
27 Chapter 375, Local Government Code, and other provisions of Chapter

1 375 that are not inconsistent with this chapter; and

2 (3) of a municipality under Subchapter A, Chapter 372,  
3 Local Government Code, to impose, levy, and collect special  
4 assessments based on benefits to property, except that the power to  
5 levy special assessments on property shall be limited to property  
6 located within the district.

7 (b) The provisions of Chapter 375, Local Government Code,  
8 that relate to the powers and jurisdiction of the Texas Commission  
9 on Environmental Quality and to the restrictions applicable to  
10 residential property do not apply to the district.

11 Sec. 3855.052. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. The district may  
12 create economic development programs and exercise the economic  
13 development powers that:

14 (1) Chapter 380, Local Government Code, provides to a  
15 municipality with a population of more than 100,000; and

16 (2) Chapter 1509, Government Code, provides to any  
17 municipality.

18 Sec. 3855.053. TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT; COMPENSATION. The  
19 board may employ and establish the terms of employment and  
20 compensation of an executive director or general manager and any  
21 other employees of the district the board considers necessary.

22 Sec. 3855.054. IMPACT FEES; EXEMPTION. (a) The district  
23 may impose impact fees in addition to those required by the city,  
24 including an impact fee on residential or commercial property, for  
25 the purposes of providing capital funding or maintenance and  
26 operating funds for improvement projects.

27 (b) The district may not impose an impact fee or assessment

1 on the property, including the equipment, rights-of-way,  
2 facilities, or improvements, of:

3 (1) an electric utility or a power generation company  
4 as defined by Section 31.002, Utilities Code;

5 (2) a gas utility as defined by Section 101.003 or  
6 121.001, Utilities Code;

7 (3) a telecommunications provider as defined by  
8 Section 51.002, Utilities Code; or

9 (4) a person who provides to the public cable  
10 television or advanced telecommunications services.

11 Sec. 3855.055. POWER TO PROVIDE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

12 (a) The district may provide, conduct, and authorize, or it may  
13 enter into contracts with a governmental entity or private party to  
14 provide, the following activities and services and the following  
15 types of improvement projects or activities in support of or  
16 incidental to its improvement projects in accordance with city  
17 requirements:

18 (1) supply and distribution facilities and systems for  
19 the purpose of providing potable and city-approved nonpotable water  
20 to the residents and businesses of the district, including  
21 wastewater collection;

22 (2) paved roads and streets, inside and outside the  
23 district to the extent authorized by Section 52, Article III, Texas  
24 Constitution;

25 (3) the planning, design, construction, improvement,  
26 and maintenance of landscaping; highway right-of-way or transit  
27 corridor beautification and improvements; lighting, banners, and

1 signs; streets and sidewalks; hiking and cycling paths and trails;  
2 pedestrian walkways, skywalks, crosswalks, and tunnels; parks,  
3 lakes, gardens, recreational and sports facilities, open space,  
4 scenic areas, and related exhibits and preserves; fountains,  
5 plazas, transit stations and related improvements, and pedestrian  
6 malls; and drainage and stormwater detention improvements;

7 (4) protection and improvement of stormwater quality  
8 that flows through the district in accordance with state permit  
9 requirements;

10 (5) the planning, design, construction, or  
11 improvement of water, sewer, or off-street parking facilities and  
12 heliports;

13 (6) the planning and acquisition of public art and  
14 sculpture and related exhibits and facilities, including  
15 educational and cultural exhibits and facilities;

16 (7) the planning, design, construction, acquisition,  
17 lease, rental, improvement, maintenance, installation, and  
18 management of and provision of furnishings for facilities for  
19 conferences, conventions, or exhibitions; manufacturer, consumer,  
20 or trade shows; civic, community, or institutional events; and  
21 exhibits, displays, attractions, special events, and seasonal or  
22 cultural celebrations and holidays;

23 (8) the removal, razing, demolition, or clearing of  
24 land or improvements in connection with any improvement project;

25 (9) the acquisition and improvement of land and other  
26 property for the mitigation of the environmental effects of any  
27 improvement project;



1           (10) the acquisition of real or personal property or  
2 an interest in real or personal property in connection with an  
3 authorized improvement project;

4           (11) any special or supplemental services for the  
5 improvement and promotion of the district or the areas adjacent to  
6 the district or for the protection of public health and safety  
7 within or adjacent to the district, including advertising,  
8 promotion, tourism, health and sanitation, public safety,  
9 security, fire protection or emergency medical services, business  
10 recruitment, development, elimination of traffic congestion, and  
11 recreational, educational, or cultural improvements, enhancements,  
12 and services; and

13           (12) any similar public improvement, facility, or  
14 service.

15           (b) The improvement projects authorized under Subsection  
16 (a) are subject to, and must comply with, the applicable codes,  
17 ordinances, and resolutions of the city. The district may not  
18 provide, conduct, or authorize any improvement project on or within  
19 the streets, highways, rights-of-way, or easements of the city or  
20 on property to be dedicated to the city subsequent to installation  
21 without the consent of the governing body of the city.

22           (c) Unless otherwise agreed to by the city and the district,  
23 the city, by ordinance, order, or resolution adopted by the  
24 governing body of the city, may require that title to and  
25 maintenance of all or any portion of improvement projects shall  
26 vest in the city without compensation for the projects in  
27 accordance with the codes, orders, resolutions, and ordinances of

1 the city. To the extent ownership and maintenance responsibilities  
2 are not assumed by the city, the district shall own, maintain, and  
3 operate the improvement projects after the date of completion of  
4 the projects, subject to the right of the city to order subsequent  
5 conveyances of the properties without compensation to the city on  
6 dates set by the city. The district shall immediately comply with  
7 any such ordinances, orders, or resolutions.

8 (d) For the purposes of this section, planning, design,  
9 construction, improvement, and maintenance of a lake includes work  
10 done for the purposes of drainage, reclamation, and recreation.

11 Sec. 3855.056. INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ZONES. (a) All or any  
12 part of the territory of the district is eligible to be included in:

13 (1) a tax increment reinvestment zone created by the  
14 city under Chapter 311, Tax Code;

15 (2) a tax abatement reinvestment zone created by the  
16 city under Chapter 312, Tax Code; or

17 (3) an enterprise zone created by the city under  
18 Chapter 2303, Government Code.

19 (b) If the city creates a tax increment reinvestment zone  
20 described by Subsection (a), the city and the board of directors of  
21 the zone, by contract with the district, may grant money deposited  
22 in the tax increment fund to the district to be used by the district  
23 for the purposes permitted for funds granted to a corporation under  
24 Section 380.002(b), Local Government Code, including the right to  
25 pledge such funds as security for any bonds issued by the district  
26 for improvement projects.

27 Sec. 3855.057. POWERS RELATED GENERALLY TO CONTRACTS AND

1 FINANCIAL MATTERS. (a) The district may:

2 (1) impose an ad valorem tax on all taxable property in  
3 the district, including industrial, commercial, and residential  
4 property, in order to finance and provide improvement projects,  
5 subject to the requirements and limitations contained in this  
6 chapter, or may impose special assessments on property in the  
7 district under Subchapters A, E, and F, Chapter 375, Local  
8 Government Code, or under this chapter and Subchapter A, Chapter  
9 372, Local Government Code;

10 (2) impose rates, fees, including impact fees, and  
11 other charges for the use of an improvement project or the  
12 consumption of a product accruing from an improvement project;

13 (3) borrow money for district purposes by issuing  
14 bonds, notes, credit agreements, or other obligations of any kind  
15 found by the board to be necessary or appropriate to the purposes  
16 and powers of the district, which must be secured by and payable  
17 from ad valorem taxes, assessments, or any other revenues of the  
18 district;

19 (4) enter into a contract with, or issue a negotiable  
20 or nonnegotiable note or warrant payable to, the city, or Tarrant  
21 County, or any other person for the accomplishment of any district  
22 purpose, including a contract for:

23 (A) the sharing of specified revenues and income  
24 of the district, or the payment, repayment, or reimbursement of any  
25 costs incurred by the city, Tarrant County, or another person for or  
26 on behalf of the district, including all or part of the costs of an  
27 improvement project and interest on the reimbursed cost;

1                   (B) the use, occupancy, lease, rental,  
2 operation, maintenance, or management of all or part of a proposed  
3 or existing improvement project; or

4                   (C) the performance of any governmental service,  
5 including law enforcement and fire protection services;

6                   (5) apply for and contract with any person to receive,  
7 administer, and perform any duty or obligation of the district  
8 under any federal, state, local, or private gift, grant, loan,  
9 conveyance, transfer, bequest, donation, or other financial  
10 assistance arrangement relating to the investigation, planning,  
11 analysis, study, design, acquisition, construction, improvement,  
12 completion, implementation, or operation by the district or others  
13 of a proposed or existing improvement project;

14                   (6) establish, revise, repeal, enforce, collect, and  
15 apply the proceeds from user fees or charges for the enjoyment,  
16 sale, rental, or other use of the district's facilities, services,  
17 properties, or improvement projects;

18                   (7) provide or secure the payment or repayment of the  
19 costs and expenses of the establishment, administration, and  
20 operation of the district and the district's costs or share of the  
21 costs of, or the revenues from, any improvement project or district  
22 contractual obligation or indebtedness by or through:

23                   (A) a lease, installment purchase contract, or  
24 other agreement with any person;

25                   (B) a tax, assessment, user fee, concession fee,  
26 or rental charge; or

27                   (C) other revenues or resources of the district;

1           (8) establish user charges related to the regulation  
2 of stormwater for the protection of water quality in the district;

3           (9) establish user charges for the use of nonpotable  
4 water for irrigation purposes, subject to the approval of the  
5 governing body of the city;

6           (10) undertake separately or jointly with other  
7 persons, including the city or Tarrant County, all or part of the  
8 cost of an improvement project, including an improvement project:

9           (A) for improving, enhancing, and supporting  
10 public safety and security, fire protection and emergency medical  
11 services, and law enforcement within and adjacent to the district;  
12 or

13           (B) that confers a general benefit on the entire  
14 district or a special benefit on a definable part of the district;  
15 and

16           (11) enter into tax abatement agreements in accordance  
17 with the general laws of the state authorizing and applicable to tax  
18 abatement agreements by municipalities.

19           (b) A contract the district enters into to carry out a  
20 purpose of this chapter may be on any terms and for any period as the  
21 board determines appropriate. Notwithstanding any other law, rule,  
22 or regulation, a state agency, the city and any other municipality,  
23 Tarrant County, any other political subdivision, any corporation,  
24 an individual, or any other entity may contract with the district to  
25 carry out the purposes of this chapter without any further  
26 authorization.

27           Sec. 3855.058. RULES AND REGULATIONS; ZONING; SECURITY.

1 (a) The district may adopt, amend, and enforce by ordinary civil  
2 remedies reasonable rules and regulations:

3 (1) for the administration and operation of the  
4 district;

5 (2) for the use, enjoyment, availability, protection,  
6 security, and maintenance of the district's properties and  
7 facilities; and

8 (3) to provide for public safety and security in the  
9 district.

10 (b) The board by rule may regulate the private use of public  
11 roadways, open spaces, parks, sidewalks, and similar public areas  
12 in the district. The rules may provide for the safe and orderly use  
13 of public roadways, open spaces, parks, sidewalks, and similar  
14 public areas or facilities. To the extent the rules of the district  
15 conflict with a rule, order, or regulation of the city, the rule,  
16 order, or regulation of the city controls.

17 (c) The board may require a permit for a parade,  
18 demonstration, celebration, entertainment event, or similar  
19 nongovernmental activity in or on the public roadways, open spaces,  
20 parks, sidewalks, and similar public areas or facilities. The  
21 board may charge a fee for the permit application and for public  
22 safety or security services in an amount the board considers  
23 necessary.

24 (d) The board may require a permit or franchise agreement  
25 with a vendor, concessionaire, exhibitor, or similar private or  
26 commercial person or organization for the limited use of the area or  
27 facilities on terms and conditions and on payment of a permit or

1 franchise fee the board may impose.

2 [Sections 3855.059-3855.100 reserved for expansion]

3 SUBCHAPTER C. INITIAL AND PERMANENT BOARD OF DIRECTORS

4 Sec. 3855.101. VACANCY. A vacancy in the office of director  
5 shall be filled by appointment of a qualified individual by the  
6 remaining directors. If at any time there are fewer than three  
7 directors, the governing body of the city shall appoint the  
8 necessary number of persons to fill all vacancies on the board.

9 Sec. 3855.102. ELIGIBILITY. (a) Section 49.052, Water  
10 Code, does not apply to the district.

11 (b) To be qualified to serve as a permanent director, a  
12 person must own land in the district.

13 Sec. 3855.103. OATH. Each director shall take the oath of  
14 office prescribed by the constitution for public office. The oath  
15 shall be filed with the district, and the district shall retain the  
16 oath in its records.

17 Sec. 3855.104. OFFICERS. The board shall elect from among  
18 the directors a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary.

19 Sec. 3855.105. COMPENSATION; BOARD POSITION NOT CIVIL  
20 OFFICE OF EMOLUMENT. (a) A position on the board may not be  
21 construed to be a civil office of emolument for any purpose,  
22 including a purpose described by Section 40, Article XVI, Texas  
23 Constitution.

24 (b) The district may compensate each director in an amount  
25 not to exceed \$50 for each board meeting and \$2,000 per year in the  
26 aggregate. In addition, a director is entitled to be reimbursed for  
27 necessary and reasonable expenses incurred in carrying out the

1 person's duties and responsibilities as a director.

2 Sec. 3855.106. QUORUM. Three directors constitute a  
3 quorum for the consideration of matters pertaining to the district.  
4 The concurrence of a majority of a quorum is required for any  
5 official action of the district.

6 Sec. 3855.107. OPEN MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION.  
7 Chapters 551 and 552, Government Code, apply to the district.

8 Sec. 3855.108. INITIAL DIRECTORS. (a) The initial board  
9 consists of the persons named in Section 3 of the Act creating the  
10 district.

11 (b) Initial directors serve until the date permanent  
12 directors are elected under Section 3855.110.

13 (c) Two initial directors shall serve until they are  
14 replaced by permanent directors elected in the uniform election in  
15 May 2012.

16 (d) Of the remaining three initial directors, two shall  
17 serve until they are replaced by permanent directors elected in the  
18 uniform election in May 2014.

19 (e) The last remaining initial director shall serve until  
20 that director is replaced by a permanent director elected in the  
21 uniform election in May 2016.

22 (f) Initial directors shall draw lots to determine which  
23 initial directors shall serve the terms described by Subsections  
24 (c), (d), and (e).

25 Sec. 3855.109. PERMANENT DIRECTORS; TERMS. The district is  
26 governed by a board of five elected directors. Elected directors  
27 serve staggered four-year terms.



1 Sec. 3855.110. ELECTION OF DIRECTORS. On the uniform  
2 election date in May of each even-numbered year, commencing in May  
3 2012, the appropriate number of permanent directors shall be  
4 elected.

5 [Sections 3855.111-3855.150 reserved for expansion]

6 SUBCHAPTER D. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX; BONDS AND OTHER

7 OBLIGATIONS

8 Sec. 3855.151. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) The  
9 district may levy and collect an ad valorem tax for operation and  
10 maintenance purposes, including funds for planning, constructing,  
11 acquiring, maintaining, repairing, and operating all improvement  
12 projects, including necessary land, plants, works, facilities,  
13 improvements, appliances, and equipment of the district, and for  
14 paying costs of proper services, engineering and legal fees, and  
15 organization and administrative expenses.

16 (b) An ad valorem tax for operation and maintenance purposes  
17 may not be levied by the district until the maximum rate of the tax  
18 is approved by the governing body of the city, by the board, and by a  
19 majority of the qualified voters in the district voting at an  
20 election held for that purpose. After the maximum rate of a tax has  
21 been authorized by the governing body of the city and by the  
22 district's voters, the board may levy, assess, and collect the tax  
23 at a rate not greater than the approved maximum rate.

24 (c) An operation and maintenance tax election may be held at  
25 the same time and in conjunction with any other district election,  
26 including the election to confirm the creation of the district. The  
27 election may be called by a separate election order or as part of

1 any other election order.

2 (d) The proposition in an operation and maintenance tax  
3 election must be for a specific maximum rate.

4 (e) If the district has any surplus operation and  
5 maintenance tax funds that are not needed for the purposes for which  
6 they were collected, the funds may be used for any lawful purpose.

7 (f) Sections 26.04, 26.05, and 26.07, Tax Code, do not apply  
8 to an operation and maintenance tax levied and collected under this  
9 section or to an ad valorem tax levied and collected for the payment  
10 of the interest on and principal of bonds issued by the district.

11 Sec. 3855.152. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER  
12 OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may issue bonds that are payable in  
13 whole or in part from ad valorem taxes in the manner provided by  
14 Subchapter J, Chapter 375, Local Government Code, subject to the  
15 other provisions of this chapter. Sections 375.207 and 375.208,  
16 Local Government Code, do not apply to bonds issued under this  
17 chapter.

18 (b) The district may issue bonds that are payable from  
19 assessments against property within the district in the manner  
20 provided for municipalities by Subchapter A, Chapter 372, Local  
21 Government Code.

22 (c) In addition to the sources of money described by  
23 Subchapter J, Chapter 375, Local Government Code, and Subchapter A,  
24 Chapter 372, Local Government Code, the district may issue bonds  
25 that are secured and made payable, wholly or partly, by a pledge of  
26 any part of the net proceeds the district receives from any other  
27 revenues of the district.

1       (d) The district may not issue bonds until the governing  
2 body of the city approves a bond issuance plan authorizing and  
3 setting forth the limitations on the issuance of the bonds. Before  
4 the district may issue bonds, impose any taxes, or borrow money, the  
5 district and the city must negotiate and execute a mutually  
6 approved and accepted interlocal project development agreement  
7 regarding the development plans and rules for the development and  
8 operation of the district and the financing of improvement  
9 projects. City approval of a bond issuance plan and the interlocal  
10 project development agreement are the only city approvals required  
11 prior to the issuance of bonds.

12       (e) The district may issue bonds or other obligations by  
13 competitive bid or negotiated sale.

14       (f) In exercising the district's powers under this section,  
15 the district may issue or execute a bond or other obligation in the  
16 form of a bond, a negotiable or nonnegotiable note, a certificate of  
17 participation, a reimbursement agreement, a reimbursement note, an  
18 instrument evidencing a proportionate interest in payments to be  
19 made by the district, or other type of obligation. The term of a  
20 bond or other obligation executed or issued under this chapter may  
21 not exceed 40 years from the date of issuance.

22       Sec. 3855.153. ELECTIONS FOR BONDS PAYABLE FROM AD VALOREM  
23 TAXES. (a) The district may not issue bonds or other obligations  
24 that are secured by and payable in whole or in part from ad valorem  
25 taxes unless the bonds and the levy of the taxes are authorized by a  
26 majority of the qualified voters in the district voting at an  
27 election held for that purpose and by the governing body of the city

1 in accordance with Section 3855.152(d).

2 (b) At the time bonds or other obligations that are payable  
3 in whole or in part from ad valorem taxes are issued, the board  
4 shall levy a continuing direct annual ad valorem tax, without limit  
5 as to rate or amount, for each year while all or part of the bonds  
6 are outstanding, and the district shall annually assess and collect  
7 an ad valorem tax on all taxable property in the district in

16 Sec. 3855.154. ASSESSMENTS; LIENS FOR ASSESSMENTS.

17 (a) The board by resolution may impose and collect an assessment  
18 for any purpose authorized by this chapter and, to the extent not  
19 inconsistent with this chapter, authorized under Subchapter F,  
20 Chapter 375, Local Government Code, or Subchapter A, Chapter 372,  
21 Local Government Code.

22 (b) An assessment, a reassessment, or an assessment  
23 resulting from an addition to or correction of the assessment roll  
24 by the district, penalties and interest on an assessment or  
25 reassessment, an expense of collection, and reasonable attorney's  
26 fees incurred by the district:

27 (1) are superior to any other lien or claim against the

1 assessed property other than a lien or claim for county, school  
2 district, city, or district ad valorem taxes; and

3 (2) are the personal liability of and a charge against  
4 the owners of the property even if the owners are not named in the  
5 assessment proceedings.

6 (c) The assessment lien is effective from the date of the  
7 board's resolution imposing the assessment until the date the  
8 assessment is paid. The lien runs with the land, continues until  
9 the assessment is paid in full, and is not eliminated by any  
10 foreclosure of an ad valorem tax lien on the same property, except  
11 that if the proceeds of a sale in foreclosure of a tax lien are not  
12 sufficient to pay both the tax lien amount that is in default and  
13 the amount due that year on any delinquent assessment, the tax line  
14 amount shall be paid in full before any amount is applied to a  
15 delinquent assessment for that year. The board may enforce the lien  
16 in the same manner that the board may enforce an ad valorem tax lien  
17 against real property.

18 (d) The board may make a correction to or deletion from the  
19 assessment roll that does not increase the amount of assessment of  
20 any parcel of land without providing notice and holding a hearing in  
21 the manner required for additional assessments.

24 Sec. 3855.201. DIVISION OF DISTRICT; REQUIREMENTS. (a) At  
25 any time before the district issues indebtedness secured by ad  
26 valorem taxes, the district may seek to divide the district into two  
27 or more districts under this section.

1        (b) A district created by division of the district must be  
2 at least 100 acres.

3        (c) Any new district created by the division of the district  
4 may not, at the time the new district is created, contain any land  
5 outside the area described by Section 2 of the Act creating this  
6 chapter.

7        (d) The board may consider a proposal to divide the district  
8 on:

9                (1) a petition of a landowner in the district; or

10               (2) a motion by the board.

11        (e) The board may not divide the district unless the  
12 division is approved by the governing body of the city by  
13 resolution.

14        (f) If the board decides to divide the district, the board  
15 shall, subject to the provisions of the resolution of the governing  
16 body of the city approving the division:

17               (1) set the terms of the division, including names for  
18 the resulting districts and a plan for the payment or performance of  
19 any outstanding district obligations; and

20               (2) prepare a metes and bounds description for each  
21 proposed district.

22        Sec. 3855.202. ELECTION FOR DIVISION OF DISTRICT.

23        (a) After the board has complied with Section 3855.201, the board  
24 shall hold an election in the district to determine whether the  
25 district should be divided as proposed.

26        (b) The board shall give notice of the election not later  
27 than the 35th day before the date of the election. The notice must

1 state:

2 (1) the date and location of the election; and

3 (2) the proposition to be voted on.

4 (c) If a majority of the votes cast are in favor of the  
5 division:

6 (1) the district shall be divided; and

7 (2) not later than the 30th day after the date of the  
8 election, the district shall provide written notice of the division  
9 to the city.

10 (d) If a majority of the votes cast are not in favor of the  
11 division, the district may not be divided.

12 Sec. 3855.203. ELECTION OF DIRECTORS OF RESULTING  
13 DISTRICTS. (a) Not later than the 90th day after the date of an  
14 election in favor of the division of the district, the board shall:

15 (1) appoint itself as the board of one of the resulting  
16 districts; and

17 (2) appoint five directors for each of the other  
18 resulting districts.

19 (b) Directors appointed under Subsection (a)(1) serve the  
20 staggered terms to which they were elected in the original  
21 district. Directors appointed under Subsection (a)(2) serve until  
22 the election for directors under Subsection (c).

23 (c) On the uniform election date in May of the first  
24 even-numbered year after the year in which the directors are  
25 appointed, an election shall be held to elect five directors in each  
26 district for which directors were appointed under Subsection  
27 (a)(2). The directors shall draw lots to determine which two

1 directors shall serve two-year terms and which three directors  
2 shall serve four-year terms.

3 (d) Except as provided by Subsection (c), directors serve  
4 staggered four-year terms. On the uniform election date in May of  
5 each even-numbered year, the appropriate number of directors shall  
6 be elected.

7 Sec. 3855.204. CONTINUING POWERS AND OBLIGATIONS OF  
8 RESULTING DISTRICTS. (a) Each resulting district may incur and  
9 pay debts and has all powers of the original district created by  
10 this chapter. Each resulting district is subject to the same  
11 limitations, provisions concerning the city, and other provisions  
12 applicable to the original district under this chapter.

13 (b) If the district is divided as provided by this  
14 subchapter, the current obligations and any bond authorizations of  
15 the district are not impaired. Debts shall be paid by revenues or  
16 by taxes or assessments imposed on real property in the district as  
17 if the district had not been divided or by contributions from each  
18 resulting district as stated in the terms set by the board under  
19 Section 3855.201.

20 (c) Any other district obligation shall be divided pro rata  
21 among the resulting districts on an acreage basis or on other terms  
22 that are satisfactory to the resulting districts.

23 Sec. 3855.205. CONTRACT AUTHORITY OF RESULTING DISTRICTS.  
24 The resulting districts may contract with each other for any matter  
25 the boards of the resulting districts consider appropriate, with  
26 the exception of water and wastewater services.

1                   SUBCHAPTER F. DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICTS

2                   Sec. 3855.251. DISSOLUTION. (a) Subject to the conditions  
3 and the other provisions of this section and to the terms,  
4 provisions, and conditions of any applicable agreement between the  
5 district and the city, the city, by ordinance duly adopted by its  
6 governing body, may dissolve the district and any additional  
7 districts created under Subchapter E.

8                   (b) The city may not dissolve a district until the  
9 district's outstanding indebtedness or contractual obligations  
10 that are payable from ad valorem taxes, if any, have been repaid or  
11 discharged.

12                   (c) The city may not dissolve a district until the city and  
13 the district have executed an interlocal project development  
14 agreement and the district's performance under such agreement has  
15 been fulfilled, including any right or obligation the district has  
16 to reimburse a developer or owner for the costs of improvement  
17 projects.

18                   (d) If, at the time of dissolution of the district, the  
19 district has bonds or other obligations outstanding that are  
20 secured by and payable from assessments or other revenues, other  
21 than ad valorem taxes, the city shall succeed to the rights and  
22 obligations of the district with respect to the enforcement and  
23 collection of the revenues or assessments. The city shall have and  
24 shall exercise all powers of the district to enforce and collect the  
25 revenues or assessments and shall apply the revenues or assessments  
26 to pay the bonds or other obligations when and as due and payable  
27 according to their terms or to pay special revenue or assessment

1 bonds or other obligations issued by the city to refund the  
2 outstanding bonds or obligations.

3 (e) Upon dissolution of the district, the board shall  
4 transfer ownership of all property and assets of the district to the  
5 city.
