## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, On November 20, 1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson 2 announced that Camp Gary in San Marcos, Texas, would serve as the 3 site of a new federal vocational training facility, and for more 4 than 40 years, the Gary Job Corps Center has contributed to 5 fulfilling the hopes and dreams of thousands of disadvantaged 6 youths in Texas; and

WHEREAS, The Gary Job Corps Center, the largest such facility 7 in the nation, has provided ongoing training and education classes 8 for at-risk youths in Texas, offering instructional classes in over 9 two dozen fields, including business computers, auto diagnostics, 10 11 health care, heating and cooling, and construction trades; ESL 12 (English as a Second Language) courses are also available, along 13 with driver's training and academic subjects leading to the 14 completion of a GED; and

WHEREAS, The accomplishments of the Gary Job Corps Center 15 extend beyond the classroom to assisting in the construction of 16 community facilities in Central Texas, and in 2002 students 17 18 assisted the United States Army Corps of Engineers with an effort to prevent flooding in Austin; the center has been recognized numerous 19 times over the years, receiving four awards at the 2005 Job Corps 20 21 Region IV Vocational Conference in Dallas, including first place 22 for vocational production and an award for the center's Business 23 and Industry Council; and

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WHEREAS, Unfortunately, the United States Department of

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Labor National Office of Job Corps is considering the elimination 1 2 of 240 student training slots at the Gary Job Corps Center by April 3 2007; the elimination of these slots would result in approximately 360 Texas youths losing the opportunity to participate in Job Corps 4 5 programs at the center; additionally, 63 staff positions would be permanently eliminated, the local community would experience an 6 economic loss of nearly \$4.5 million, and local employers would 7 8 lose the valuable asset of well-trained employees; and

9 WHEREAS, While Texas has not been immune to a nationwide decline in Job Corps enrollment, the state is committed to the 10 success of the Gary Job Corps Center and is prepared to assist the 11 center in recruitment efforts to achieve and maintain 100 percent 12 capacity; the at-risk youths of Texas deserve every opportunity 13 14 afforded to them, and the elimination of the student training slots 15 at the facility would be a detriment not only to prospective students, but to the State of Texas as a whole; now, therefore, be 16 17 it

18 RESOLVED, That the 80th Legislature of the State of Texas 19 hereby urge the United States Department of Labor to reconsider the 20 proposed reduction in student training slots at the Gary Job Corps 21 Center in San Marcos, Texas; and, be it further

22 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward an 23 official copy of this resolution to the secretary of the United 24 States Department of Labor.

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
