WHEREAS, Lieutenant General Ricardo S. Sanchez has concluded an illustrious military career that saw him rise to the highest ranks of the United States Army and faithfully serve his country for

4 more than 30 years; and

WHEREAS, With his retirement in November 2006, General Sanchez has settled in San Antonio, and it is a pleasure to welcome this esteemed commander home to the Lone Star State; and

WHEREAS, It was in the South Texas town of Rio Grande City that Ricardo Sanchez grew up, and the lessons he learned there about hard work and the value of education helped to shape his later military career; a graduate of Texas A&I University-Kingsville, he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army in 1973; over the following decades, he distinguished himself in a series of assignments and advanced steadily through the ranks; and

WHEREAS, A specialist in armored combat, this valiant officer commanded tank companies and battalions and ably completed a number of other senior-level assignments, with his duties taking him to various foreign countries, including Korea, Germany, and Panama; General Sanchez also honed his skills through studies at the Naval Postgraduate School, where he obtained his master's degree in operations research and systems analysis engineering, the Command and General Staff College, and the U.S. Army War College; and

WHEREAS, Following the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait in 1990, he led the 2nd Battalion of the 69th Armor Regiment into combat as part

- 1 of Operation Desert Storm and Operation Desert Shield; his
- 2 battalion contributed to the coalition victory by spearheading the
- 3 assault of the 24th Infantry Division into Iraq; and
- 4 WHEREAS, General Sanchez took charge of the 1st Armored
- 5 Division in 2001 and supervised its deployment for Operation Iraqi
- 6 Freedom in 2003; in June of that year, he was promoted to the rank of
- 7 three-star or lieutenant general and assumed command of the Army's
- 8 V Corps; this assignment placed him in charge of the Combined Joint
- 9 Task Force in Iraq, and for the next year, Lieutenant General
- 10 Sanchez helped direct the effort to restore and reconstruct Iraq's
- infrastructure while overseeing the country's security; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In establishing his remarkable record of service,
- 13 Lieutenant General Sanchez received a long list of official
- 14 commendations, and he may also reflect proudly on his
- 15 groundbreaking role in the military and in American society as a
- 16 whole; in his advance to the senior levels of command, he became the
- 17 highest ranking officer of Latino descent in the U.S. Army; for his
- 18 myriad achievements and for his steadfast dedication to the
- 19 nation's security, Ricardo Sanchez is deserving of acclaim and
- 20 gratitude; now, therefore, be it

- 22 hereby pay tribute to Lieutenant General Ricardo S. Sanchez
