## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Special Olympics Texas has nurtured the athletic capacity, the self-confidence, and the leadership skills of its participants for nearly four decades, and many of its athletes are visiting the Capitol on March 6, 2007; and
