CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The valiant men and women of the United States armed services risk their lives and well-being to defend their country, and our hearts go out to those who are wounded in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, Silver Star Day, an observance that is celebrated in a growing number of states, pays tribute to members of the military who suffer wounds or serious illness as a result of their war service; typically observed on May 1, Silver Star Day is a show of support for those uniformed men and women who are recovering from injuries; and

WHEREAS, The color silver has been associated with wounded personnel since World War I; silver stars were used in some states to designate a battle injury, and the tradition developed of covering the blue star on service flags with silver material if a military figure was wounded, while a gold star signified that an individual had been killed in action; and

WHEREAS, Today, the organization Silver Star Families of America is continuing the tradition by providing silver star flags and banners and certificates of appreciation to those who are wounded or fall ill while serving in a war zone; this group also assists wounded veterans in other ways, including providing care packages to them while they are recuperating from their injuries and engaging in advocacy and educational initiatives; and
