HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1-8 WHEREAS, The valiant men and women of the United States armed 1-9 services risk their lives and well-being to defend their country, 1-10 and our hearts go out to those who are wounded in the line of duty; 1-11 and

1-12 WHEREAS, Silver Star Day, an observance that is celebrated in 1-13 a growing number of states, pays tribute to members of the military 1-14 who suffer wounds or serious illness as a result of their war 1-15 service; typically observed on May 1, Silver Star Day is a show of 1-16 support for those uniformed men and women who are recovering from 1-17 injuries; and

1-18 WHEREAS, The color silver has been associated with wounded 1-19 personnel since World War I; silver stars were used in some states 1-20 to designate a battle injury, and the tradition developed of 1-21 covering the blue star on service flags with silver material if a 1-22 military figure was wounded, while a gold star signified that an 1-23 individual had been killed in action; and

1-24 WHEREAS, Today, the organization Silver Star Families of 1-25 America is continuing the tradition by providing silver star flags 1-26 and banners and certificates of appreciation to those who are 1-27 wounded or fall ill while serving in a war zone; this group also 1-28 assists wounded veterans in other ways, including providing care 1-29 packages to them while they are recuperating from their injuries 1-30 and engaging in advocacy and educational initiatives; and

1-30 and engaging in advocacy and educational initiatives; and 1-31 WHEREAS, Military veterans who have been wounded in service 1-32 to their country are deserving of the highest respect, and it is 1-33 most appropriate for the State of Texas to honor them with the 1-34 designation of Silver Star Day; now, therefore, be it 1-35 RESOLVED, That the 80th Legislature of the State of Texas
