## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, In 1954, the United States Congress authorized the 2 construction of Lake Somerville to provide flood control, water 3 conservation, and other beneficial uses for nearby areas; 4 subsequently, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers began reservoir 5 construction in 1962 and began to impound water in 1967; and

6 WHEREAS, Straddling the borders of Burleson, Washington, and 7 Lee Counties, on Yegua Creek 20 river miles upstream from that 8 creek's confluence with the Brazos River, the lake has a storage 9 capacity of 337,700 acre-feet; and

10 WHEREAS, Operation of the lake is supervised by the Fort 11 Worth District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers; the lake is one 12 of nine federal reservoirs that are integrated into the Brazos 13 River Authority's basin-wide system and associated water resource 14 development master plan; and

15 WHEREAS, The Brazos River Authority owns the stored water, a 16 source from which it furnishes supplies to the City of Brenham 17 according to a contract that was last renewed for a 10-year period 18 in 2003; and

WHEREAS, Also significantly involved in the region is the Lower Colorado River Authority, which, from its diverse mix of power plants, provides wholesale electricity to various communities as well as offering them its economic research and expertise; and

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WHEREAS, Although Lake Somerville has long been a tourist

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1 destination for fishing and other water recreation, the facility 2 has not fully effectuated the three-county economic impact that 3 originally was expected at the time that it was built; and

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WHEREAS, A study of Lake Somerville's role in economic development would assist in explaining why the lake has not yet had that impact, beyond the tourism industry, and would help to identify impediments that currently restrict its contribution as well as strategies that would better maximize its economic potential; now, therefore, be it

10 RESOLVED, That the 80th Legislature of the State of Texas 11 hereby request the Brazos River Authority and the Lower Colorado 12 River Authority to conduct, with appropriate input from the public 13 and private sectors, a joint baseline study of the role of Lake 14 Somerville in the economic development of the surrounding vicinity; 15 and, be it further

16 RESOLVED, That the two authorities jointly submit a full 17 report of their findings and recommendations to the 81st 18 Legislature when that legislature convenes in January 2009.

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
