A JOINT RESOLUTION

- proposing a constitutional amendment concerning the restriction on
 the rate of growth of state appropriations.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 22, Article VIII, Texas Constitution, is 5 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 22. (a) In no biennium shall the rate of growth of appropriations from all sources of revenue except the federal government [state tax revenues not dedicated by this constitution] exceed a rate equal to the sum of the estimated rate of growth of the state's population and the estimated rate of inflation in the state [economy]. In this subsection, the rate of growth of appropriations from the current biennium to the next biennium is
- 14 <u>(1) the lesser of:</u>
- (A) the amount of money appropriated for the current biennium from all sources of revenue other than the federal government, as cumulatively estimated by the comptroller at the times the comptroller endorsed, in accordance with Article III, Section 49a, of this constitution, the comptroller's certificate on
- 20 <u>the bills making the appropriations; and</u>

the percentage difference between:

- (B) the amount of money actually appropriated for the current biennium from all sources of revenue other than the federal government, using the most recently available information;

- 1 (2) the amount of money appropriated for the next
- 2 biennium from all sources of revenue other than the federal
- 3 government, as finally estimated by the comptroller at the times
- 4 the Acts making appropriations are considered by the comptroller
- 5 under Article III, Section 49a, of this constitution.
- 6 <u>(b)</u> The legislature shall provide by general law procedures 7 to implement <u>Subsection (a) of this section [subsection]</u>.
- 8 (c) [(b)] If the legislature by adoption of a resolution
- 9 approved by a record vote of two-thirds [a majority] of the members
- 10 of each house finds that an emergency exists and identifies the
- 11 nature of the emergency, the legislature may provide for
- 12 appropriations in excess of the amount authorized by Subsection (a)
- 13 of this section. The excess authorized under this subsection may
- 14 not exceed the amount specified in the resolution.
- (d) Appropriations may not [(c) In no case shall
- 16 appropriations] exceed revenues as provided in Article III, Section
- 17 49a, of this constitution. Nothing in this section shall be
- 18 construed to alter, amend, or repeal Article III, Section 49a, of
- 19 this constitution.
- 20 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
- 21 the Texas Constitution:
- 22 <u>TEMPORARY PROVISION.</u> (a) This temporary provision applies
- 23 to the amendment to Section 22, Article VIII, of this constitution,
- 24 proposed by the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007,
- 25 restricting the rate of growth of appropriations from all sources
- of revenue except the federal government to a rate equal to the sum
- of the estimated rate of growth of the state's population and the

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- 1 <u>estimated rate of inflation in the state. This temporary provision</u>
- 2 expires December 1, 2009.
- 3 (b) The changes made to Section 22, Article VIII, of this
- 4 constitution by the amendment apply only in relation to
- 5 appropriations made for the state fiscal biennium beginning
- 6 September 1, 2009, and subsequent state fiscal bienniums.
- 7 Appropriations for the state fiscal biennium that began September
- 8 1, 2007, are governed by Section 22, Article VIII, as it existed
- 9 immediately before the amendment was approved by the voters.
- 10 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 11 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2008.
- 12 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 13 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to limit the rate of
- 14 growth of the state budget paid from all sources of revenue except
- 15 the federal government to a rate equal to the sum of the rate of
- 16 growth of the state's population and the rate of inflation."
