RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Honorable Tom J. Vandergriff, whose name has 2 become a byword in North Texas for outstanding public service and 3 vigorous, visionary leadership, is retiring from the post of 4 Tarrant County judge in January 2007; and

5 WHEREAS, This distinguished Texan has held elective office 6 for the better part of six decades; his career in government began with a highly regarded, 26-year tenure as mayor of Arlington, a 7 tenure that coincided with one of the most transformative periods 8 in that city's history; between 1951, when he was first sworn in, 9 and 1977, when he concluded his final term as mayor, the population 10 11 of Arlington soared from fewer than 8,000 inhabitants to 12 approximately 120,000; and

13 WHEREAS, During those years, Judge Vandergriff helped to 14 facilitate the construction of the Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport and the elevation of Arlington State College, now The 15 University of Texas at Arlington, to senior college status; he also 16 worked to stimulate the region's tourism industry, notably through 17 18 the instrumental role he played in bringing major-league baseball to North Texas; Judge Vandergriff persuaded the owner of the 19 Washington Senators to move his club to Arlington, where the team 20 21 took the field as the Texas Rangers; for a time after the club 22 relocated, Judge Vandergriff even served as a broadcaster for the 23 Rangers' games; and

WHEREAS, Six years after retiring as mayor, Judge Vandergriff

became the first person to represent the newly created 26th
Congressional District in the United States House of
Representatives, an office he held until 1985; and

4 WHEREAS, Since returning to public service in 1991, Judge Vandergriff has continued to use his formidable skills and 5 6 experience to help address the challenges and opportunities facing his community; the scope of efforts undertaken by the county 7 8 commissioners court under his guidance is reflected in several 9 recent achievements; in December 2005, Tarrant County implemented an expanded, online tax-payment system that subsequently won the 10 county an Excellence Award from the Texas Association of 11 Governmental Information Technology Managers; the year 2005 also 12 saw the opening of a \$41 million Family Law Center and the 13 commencement of work to clear the site for the new Dallas Cowboys 14 15 stadium; and

16 WHEREAS, Widely respected both in and out of government 17 circles, Judge Vandergriff served as founding president of the 18 North Central Texas Council of Governments, as the first chair of 19 the Texas Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations, and 20 as a member of a White House Commission on Urban Problems; he has 21 also been named Citizen of the Year in Arlington, Dallas, and Fort 22 Worth; and

WHEREAS, Born and raised in Carrollton, Tom Vandergriff holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Southern California; in addition to his achievements as a public servant, he has enjoyed notable success as a businessman in the private sector, where his interests have included a car dealership and an insurance agency;
