WHEREAS, His tenure as county treasurer began when he was appointed to the office in March 1974, and Presidio County residents voted to retain him in that job later the same year; over the following decades, this skilled administrator was a beneficial and reassuring presence in the Marfa courthouse, serving eight consecutive terms as the chief custodian of the county's finances; Mr. Rivera's experience and knowledge were highly respected by his peers, who made him a member of the regional board of directors and the state board of directors for the County Treasurers' Association of Texas; and

WHEREAS, An involved member of the community throughout his life, Mr. Rivera has been active in various civic organizations, including the Lions Club, the Kiwanis Club, and the American Legion
