WHEREAS, A native of Chicago, Ms. Higginbotham began her 4 career at the Kennedy Space Center in 1987 after earning a 5 bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Southern Illinois 6 University at Carbondale; she quickly proved herself a talented 7 engineer and an astute leader, and by the end of her nine-year 8 tenure at the center, she had participated in more than 50 space 9 shuttle launches; moreover, she obtained master's degrees 10 in 11 management and space systems from the Florida Institute of 12 Technology; and

13 WHEREAS, Ms. Higginbotham was selected to join the NASA 14 astronaut corps in April 1996 and reported to the Johnson Space Center that same year; since then, she has completed intensive 15 training and gained vital experience in various branches of the 16 agency; in December 2006, she completed her first space flight as a 17 crew member of shuttle mission STS-116, for which she served as 18 mission specialist; considered one of NASA's most complex missions, 19 STS-116 entailed rewiring the space station, and for her part, 20 21 Mission Specialist Higginbotham successfully operated the robotics 22 arm and oversaw the transfer of equipment from the shuttle to the 23 station; and
