

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, After 32 years of dedicated service to his fellow
2 citizens, Culberson County Judge John Conoly is retiring from
3 public office, concluding an impressive tenure marked by myriad
4 civic improvements; and

5 WHEREAS, Judge Conoly is the second-longest tenured county
6 judge in Texas; a testament to his dedication and commitment to the
7 men and women he has dutifully served for more than three decades,
8 he remembers missing only one meeting of the commissioners court
9 during his 32-year tenure as county judge; and

10 WHEREAS, In addition to presiding over some 4,000 criminal
11 and civil cases at the county court level, Judge Conoly offered
12 leadership on initiatives to implement a 24-hour dispatch service,
13 as well as a state-of-the-art communication system, in the
14 sheriff's office; he also worked closely with county commissioners
15 to make improvements to the county jail and create a countywide
16 9-1-1 emergency service; and

17 WHEREAS, With an eye toward the future, this dynamic
18 consensus-builder oversaw the development and construction of
19 numerous civic enterprises, including the Senior Citizen Nutrition
20 Center, the Courthouse Annex, Veterans Memorial Park, a major
21 renovation of the airport, a new and better-equipped fire station,
22 and the West Texas Boys and Girls Club facility, to name just a few;

24 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Judge Conoly has relied on the

1 love and support of his devoted wife, Martha, and his strong and
2 enduring faith; and

3 WHEREAS, Judge Conoly's tenure has seen a great deal of
4 positive change for the people of Culberson County, and his legacy
5 of success and achievement will ensure that he is not soon forgotten
6 by his friends and fellow citizens; now, therefore, be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
8 Legislature hereby commend Judge John Conoly for his many years of
9 service to the citizens of Culberson County and extend to him best
10 wishes for joy and happiness in his well-deserved retirement; and,

12 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
13 prepared for Judge Conoly as an expression of high regard by the
14 Texas House of Representatives.
