moreover, he racked up 2,199 passing yards and tallied another 12

abilities as a leader; the Titans were winless before he took over

19 as the starting quarterback, but his competitive drive and stellar

- 9 season, Vince Young has burnished his reputation as a player of
- 10 great skill and immense potential, and he is most deserving of
