WHEREAS, With her unique perspective as a student, teacher, and administrator, Dr. Perryman knew Angleton ISD, and was instrumental in creating new technological, curriculum, and accountability programs to strengthen the schools; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Perryman was a tireless worker, who led by example and earned the highest respect of the district's students, teachers, administrators, and parents; and
