RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Demonstrating a thirst for knowledge and an 2 unflagging determination to succeed, Geronimo Rodriguez, Jr., went 3 from picking fruit as a migrant farm worker to helping select 4 President Clinton's cabinet as a member of the White House staff; 5 and

6 WHEREAS, Growing up, this Hidalgo County native spent eight months a year traveling from the Rio Grande Valley to the 7 Northwestern United States, harvesting seasonal crops with his 8 parents; he became the first person in his family to earn a high 9 school diploma, graduating near the top of his class, and received a 10 11 College Assistance Migrant Program scholarship to St. Edward's 12 University in Austin, where he achieved another first in his family 13 in 1990 when he graduated from college; following his instincts for 14 law and politics, he took a job with the Texas Attorney General, and in 1991 became the state field director for Bill Clinton's first 15 16 presidential campaign; and

17 WHEREAS, A few years later, after earning a law degree from 18 The University of Texas, he was asked to be the deputy statewide 19 director for Arizona during President Clinton's reelection 20 campaign; in that capacity, he was instrumental in the state 21 electing a Democrat for the first time in more than 50 years; and

WHEREAS, His reputation for excellence earned him a job in the nation's capital as chief of staff for the Office of Congressional and Intergovernmental Affairs at the U.S. Department

of Labor; in addition, he served as acting associate director in the White House Office of Presidential Personnel, where he had the opportunity to recommend one-third of President Clinton's senior-level appointments, and Mr. Rodriguez further distinguished himself as counsel to the solicitor at the U.S. Department of Labor from 1999 to 2001; and

7 WHEREAS, He then returned to Texas and joined the firm of 8 Leonard Frost Levin Van Court & Marsh in Austin; remaining active in 9 politics, he was the state director and Colorado base vote director 10 for the Democratic presidential ticket in 2004; and

11 WHEREAS, Mr. Rodriguez has demonstrated a dedication to his 12 community with his service on the boards of the Austin Public 13 Library Foundation and the Austin Young Lawyers Association, as the 14 secretary of the Mexican American Bar Association of Texas, as the 15 chair of the Hispanic Bar Association of Austin Foundation, and as a 16 member of the Austin public television station's Hispanic Network 17 of Advisors; and

18 WHEREAS, With enthusiasm and sincere dedication, Geronimo 19 Rodriguez, Jr., has made many important contributions in behalf of 20 his fellow citizens, especially helping to advance the role of 21 Hispanics in the fields of politics and law, and his passionate 22 involvement will undoubtedly continue to benefit Texans for years 23 to come; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas Legislature hereby commend Geronimo Rodriguez, Jr., for his exemplary public engagement and extend to him sincere best wishes for continued success and happiness; and, be it further
