RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Dr. Wendell Nedderman has been an active member of 1 2 Kiwanis International for more than a half-century, and his 3 committed service to his fellow Texans embodies the Kiwanis ideals of serving the local community and contributing time to support 4 5 children and young adults; and WHEREAS, Dr. Nedderman's involvement in Kiwanis dates back to 6 1955, when he began attending the meetings of the College Station 7 chapter; following his relocation to the Dallas-Fort Worth area in 8 joined the Kiwanis Club of Arlington; an active 9 1959, he participant in the club's meetings and service projects ever since, 10 11 he has expressed his wholehearted support of the organization's 12 programs, believing that they greatly influence young people's 13 lives for the better; and WHEREAS, Dr. Nedderman's interest in assisting Texas youth 14 has also been reflected in his professional life; following his 15 service as a naval officer in World War II, he began a distinguished 16 academic career; hired as an instructor at Texas A&M University in 17 18 January 1947, he began a 12-year association with the university, during which time he earned both his master's degree from A&M and 19 his doctoral degree in civil engineering from Iowa State 20 21 University; and WHEREAS, Moving to Arlington State College in 1959, Dr. 22 23 Nedderman became the founding dean of the newly established School

of Engineering; in 1969, he was named vice president for academic

affairs, and three years later he was chosen as president of the university; he led the school, which had in the meantime become The University of Texas at Arlington, for 20 years, stepping down in 1992 but continuing to teach in the School of Engineering until his retirement in 2005; a revered figure at the university, he has been given the title of president emeritus, and a street as well as the engineering building on the campus are named in his honor; moreover, his accomplishments have elicited prestigious honors, including the Mirabeau Lamar Award from the Association of Texas Colleges and Universities; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Nedderman has also devoted his talents to a variety of other groups and institutions in North Texas; a member of the board of directors at Arlington Memorial Hospital and a trustee for Texas Health Resources, he has assisted organizations such as the North Texas Commission, the Longhorn Council of Boy Scouts, the Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce, and the United Way; his community service, combined with his academic accomplishments and his many decades of activity with Kiwanis International, has defined Wendell Nedderman as a civic leader of the first order, and his dedication to assisting his fellow citizens has been an immense benefit to the State of Texas; now, therefore, be it
