1 WHEREAS, Words cannot express the heartache felt at the loss
2 of U.S. Army Specialist Mitchel Thomas Mutz of Falls City, who died
3 in Iraq on November 15, 2006, at the age of 23; and

4 WHEREAS, Assigned to the 1st Battalion, 12th Cavalry
5 Regiment, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division at Fort
6 Hood, Specialist Mutz was on his second tour of duty in Iraq when he
7 was mortally wounded in Baquba; and

8 WHEREAS, Born in San Antonio, Specialist Mutz graduated in
9 2001 from Falls City High School, where he was a member of the
10 basketball and golf teams; he attended Coastal Bend College for two
11 years before making the decision to serve his country in February
12 2003; six months later, he began specialized training to become a
13 cavalry scout; and

14 WHEREAS, Our state and nation are fortunate to have young men
15 and women whose love of country leads them to military duty, and
16 time can never diminish the profound debt that Americans owe to
17 Mitchel Mutz for the service he undertook and the sacrifice he
18 rendered; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
20 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of U.S. Army Specialist
21 Mitchel Thomas Mutz and extend sincere sympathy to the members of
22 his family: to his parents, Bobby and Dixie Mutz; to his brother,
23 Nathan Mutz, and his wife, Shawna; to his grandmother, Elizabeth
