WHEREAS, Following his retirement, he was elected to the Texas Silver-Haired Legislature, and he is the only African American male serving in the body; he has been vice chair of the human service and criminal justice committees, and in 1998, he became the first African American from Bexar County elected to the National Silver Haired Congress, for which he is vice chair of the human service committee; moreover, he will serve as president at

- 9 representative on the City County Joint Commission on Elderly

- 11 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, he enjoys the love and support
- of his wife of 50 years, the former Juretta Williams, and of his
- 13 children, Larry and Mitzi, and daughter-in-law, Sherry, and he is
- 14 the proud grandfather of three granddaughters, Amber, Alia, and
- 15 Sydnie; a faithful member of Second Baptist Church, he serves as a
- 16 deacon and sings in the male chorus; and
- WHEREAS, Lewis Marshall has worked tirelessly to improve the
- 18 lives of senior citizens in Bexar County and the Lone Star State,
- 19 and his commitment to this large and important constituency has
- 20 earned him the respect and admiration of all who are privileged to
