RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, A delegation of proud citizens of Van Zandt County 2 is visiting the State Capitol to celebrate Van Zandt County Day on 3 March 13, 2007; and

WHEREAS, Encompassing blackland prairie terrain and rolling hills, scenic Van Zandt County was first populated by the Caddo and Cherokee tribes; after the defeat of the Cherokee at the Battle of the Neches in 1839, the area was opened to nonnative settlers; the county was officially established in 1848 and named for Republic of Texas leader Isaac Van Zandt; and

WHEREAS, John Jordan began the county's long history in the salt trade in 1845, when he founded his salt extraction business at Jordan's Saline, which later became Grand Saline; by the end of the 19th century, ranching and livestock farming were also well established in the county, and the discovery of oil near Van in 1929 further bolstered the county's fortunes; and

WHEREAS, Today, oil and ranching continue to sustain Van Zandt County, and it is a major producer of hay, sweet potatoes, blueberries, and nursery crops; salt production is also part of the modern economy; the Morton Salt mine in Grand Saline extends over 60 acres and reaches a depth of 700 feet, holding enough salt to supply the world for 20,000 years; and

WHEREAS, Many fascinating attractions highlight the county's rich history and heritage; the only building in North America built entirely out of rock salt, the Salt Palace in Grand Saline serves as

a museum that commemorates the salt industry in Texas, the history of the town, and the life of famous aviator and Grand Saline native Wiley Post; the Edgewood Heritage Park Historical Museum features 14 restored buildings that evoke rural life in northeastern Texas; in Wills Point, the Depot Museum displays a fine collection of vintage clothing, historical farming implements, and railroad memorabilia; and

WHEREAS, Adding to the county's allure are a variety of special events; First Monday Trade Days in Canton, the county seat, is an enormous flea market where every month 300 acres of antiques and arts and crafts draw huge crowds; the annual Grand Saline Salt Festival takes place in late May and early June and includes nightly street dancing, a rodeo, and an antique tractor show; every April, the Bluebird Festival is held in Wills Point and features quilt displays, a train exhibition, and the Little Miss Bluebird pageant; year round, the county's natural beauty is an attraction in itself, with Lake Tawakoni being an especially popular destination for its fishing, boating, and camping opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Historic and beautiful (and salty), Van Zandt County is home to 50,000 industrious residents who can take justifiable pride in their invaluable contribution to the culture, economy, and traditions of the Lone Star State; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas Legislature hereby recognize March 13, 2007, as Van Zandt County Day at the State Capitol and extend sincere best wishes to the visitors from that county for a memorable stay in Austin.
