1 WHEREAS, For more than three decades, the Texas Association
2 of Mexican-American Chambers of Commerce has served as the leading
3 advocate of Hispanic businesses in Texas; and

4 WHEREAS, Founded in 1975, TAMACC strives to strengthen the
5 coalition of Hispanic business owners around the state, stimulate
6 new enterprises in Hispanic communities, disseminate useful
7 information to members, and advocate for Hispanic business in
8 international trade development, consumer affairs, and public
9 policy; and

10 WHEREAS, The organization was originally composed of a small
11 group of forward-looking Hispanic business owners and
12 professionals; today, it consists of 27 member chambers of commerce
13 and 20 corporate partners, representing 15,000 Hispanic
14 professionals throughout the state; and

15 WHEREAS, In July 2006, the TAMACC Educational Development
16 Foundation cohosted the first High School Business Leadership
17 Seminars at The University of Texas at El Paso; in an effort to
18 inspire future entrepreneurs and community leaders, the event
19 featured role models from business, public service, and education
20 who offered valuable advice to the young men and women in
21 attendance; and

22 WHEREAS, TAMACC serves as an important resource for Hispanic
23 businesses in Texas as well as for future business leaders, and it
24 is a pleasure to recognize this notable group for its vision and its

1 dedication to its worthy goals; now, therefore, be it

4 Mexican-American Chambers of Commerce for its outstanding service
