RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Many notable citizens of Amarillo and Lubbock and 2 their outstanding and supportive neighbors from other communities 3 located in the Texas Panhandle and South Plains are visiting Austin 4 on February 27, 2007, to pay tribute to their region's rich heritage 5 and to celebrate Panhandle and South Plains Day at the State 6 Capitol; and

7 WHEREAS, A thriving region of the state, the Panhandle and 8 South Plains are home to one of the oldest inhabited places in 9 Texas, the Lubbock Lake Site, a national historic and state 10 archeological landmark where evidence of some 12,000 years of 11 continuous habitation has been discovered; and

WHEREAS, Stretching through the northern part of the region is Palo Duro Canyon, the second largest canyon in the country, which boasts spectacular views and reveals, through its exposed strata, a geologic record spanning 250 million years; and

16 WHEREAS, Rich in history, this remarkable region of vast 17 scenic plains is known for its traditional ranch lands, crop and 18 meat production, large stretches of oil and gas reserves, major 19 industry, and nationally recognized employees with a work ethic 20 that is beyond reproach; and

21 WHEREAS, Amarillo, the northern principal city of the 22 Panhandle and South Plains, is a dynamic urban center with a 23 population of more than 180,000 and affords its residents and 24 visitors a wide array of cultural amenities; contributing to

Amarillo's economic vitality are a Bell Helicopter tilt-rotor assembly center, where the V-22 Osprey and the US101 presidential helicopters are assembled, as well as the only assembly/disassembly plant for the nation's nuclear weapons arsenal, a facility operated by BWXT Pantex for the U.S. Department of Energy's National Nuclear Security Administration; and

WHEREAS, Lubbock is the southern principal city of the 7 8 Panhandle and South Plains; today, with a population of 9 approximately 210,000, the community is home to the largest medical infrastructure between Dallas and Los Angeles and enjoys a 10 diversified economy that draws its strength from agribusiness, 11 manufacturing, and commerce; with the growth of cotton culture on 12 the High Plains, Lubbock has become one of the world's primary 13 14 centers for the processing of cottonseed; the city's economy is 15 further bolstered by numerous small businesses that were the first in the state to band together to make insurance more affordable for 16 17 employers, resulting in almost 7,000 covered employees, 1,500 of which were previously without major medical coverage; and 18

WHEREAS, The Panhandle and South Plains are also home to 19 excellent educational institutions whose successes ensure that the 20 21 area will continue to prosper; the Texas Tech University System, including its medical, law, and pharmacy schools, and West Texas 22 A&M University are among the premier institutions in Texas and 23 24 boast ever-increasing enrollments, nationally recognized programs 25 and faculty, and outstanding graduates; Amarillo College and South 26 Plains College, which continue to be among the finest community colleges in the country, and Lubbock Christian University, Wayland 27

Baptist University, Frank Phillips College, Western Texas College,
and Clarendon College, are other outstanding educational
institutions in the Texas Panhandle and South Plains; and

WHEREAS, Area attractions include the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum, the largest history museum in the state, located on the campus of West Texas A&M University in Canyon, and Texas Tech University is home to many restored structures at the National Ranching Heritage Center, a 15-acre site tracing the evolution of ranch architecture and the history of the cattle industry in Texas; and

11 WHEREAS, The citizens of the Panhandle and South Plains 12 regions are renowned for their friendliness and warmth; they have 13 helped to build vital urban centers that serve not only a large part 14 of Texas but also of eastern New Mexico, and it is indeed 15 appropriate to take this opportunity to pay tribute to them; now, 16 therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas 18 Legislature hereby recognize February 27, 2007, as Panhandle and 19 South Plains Day at the State Capitol and extend to the delegation 20 in attendance today, and to all their fellow citizens, sincere 21 appreciation for the bright luster they add to the Lone Star State.
