RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, On February 28, 2007, people from across Atascosa 2 County are traveling to the State Capitol to celebrate their 3 community's heritage and to share with fellow Texans their history, 4 traditions, and achievements; and

5 WHEREAS, The name Atascosa, derived from the Spanish word for boggy terrain, was used to describe the area as early as 1788; 6 during the first part of the 19th century, this grassy prairie 7 Texas attracted 8 region of South Spanish, Mexican, and Anglo-American settlers, and by the time of the Texas Revolution, 9 its ranching industry was flourishing; and 10

11 WHEREAS, In 1856, the region was sufficiently populated to be 12 sectioned off from Bexar County; the original county seat at 13 Navatasco was later permanently moved to the centrally located town 14 of Jourdanton; and

15 WHEREAS, Situated next to the famous Camino Real, the county 16 has long benefited from its proximity to major transportation 17 arteries linking it with the Gulf Coast, the Rio Grande Valley, and 18 Mexico, as well as other major population centers; and

WHEREAS, Atascosa County enjoys the economic benefits reaped by an abundance of natural resources and, blessed with productive range and irrigated farmland, the area is known for its farming and ranching industries; and

23 WHEREAS, Proud of its ranching heritage, Pleasanton, the 24 county's trading center, bills itself as the birthplace of the

1 cowboy, a designation symbolized by a large bronze statue in front 2 of city hall; in nearby Poteet, known to many as the Strawberry 3 Capital of the World, a seven-foot, 1,600-pound monument to the 4 fruit graces the front lawn of city hall and a Strawberry Festival, 5 the fourth-largest agricultural festival in the state, takes place 6 in April; and

7 WHEREAS, Other resources such as oil and gas also play a 8 significant role in the county's ongoing development, but the most 9 important asset in the area's increasingly diverse economy is 10 undoubtedly its industrious citizenry; and

WHEREAS, For more than a century, residents of Atascosa County have contributed to the economic and cultural development of Texas, and they are justifiably proud of their rich history; it is indeed appropriate that they be honored on this day; now, therefore, be it

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas 17 Legislature hereby recognize February 28, 2007, as Atascosa County 18 Day at the State Capitol and extend a warm welcome to all visitors 19 from that fine county.
