

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, A businessman who excelled in many fields and who
2 was a highly respected community leader in Houston, William James
3 Miller passed away on July 18, 2006, at age 78; and

4 WHEREAS, Born March 17, 1928, Bill Miller grew up in Houston
5 and served his country as a paratrooper in the U.S. Army's 11th
6 Airborne Division, which occupied Japan in World War II; following
7 his discharge, he earned a bachelor's degree in chemical
8 engineering from Texas A&M University then moved to Massachusetts
9 to attend the Harvard Business School, graduating with a master's
10 degree in 1953; and

11 WHEREAS, Returning to Houston with his wife, the former Mary
12 Catherine Farrington, and their children, Mr. Miller began a
13 business career that saw him assume a leadership role in a number of
14 companies; in the energy services industry, he founded Miller Oil
15 and Gas, which he directed for the rest of his life, and he was
16 president of Houston Engineers, Inc., which developed the Hydra-Jar
17 tool used in oil drilling; applying his expertise to the banking and
18 insurance sector, he became president of the Lawrence Ilfrey
19 Insurance Company, chaired the founding board of the Bank of
20 Tanglewood, which later became the Bank of Texas, and was a board
21 member for University State Bank and for Tanglewood Bank, which is
22 now Northern Trust Bank; and

23 WHEREAS, The interests of this notable entrepreneur also
24 extended to real estate development; during his 30-year tenure as

1 president of the Tanglewood Corporation, he oversaw the creation of
2 several business and residential complexes in Houston's Tanglewood
3 neighborhood; he was also a driving force in the growth of Uptown
4 Houston, serving as the first president of the improvement district
5 that administered the area and acting as chair of the Uptown Houston
6 Association; and

7 WHEREAS, A prominent figure in civic and religious affairs,
8 he was active in numerous organizations, including the Kiwanis Club
9 of Downtown Houston, the Houston Child Guidance Center, and the
10 Texas Medical Center Library, and was a member of the vestries of
11 Saint John the Divine Episcopal Church and Saint Martin's Episcopal
12 Church; devoted to his wife, children, and grandchildren, Mr.
13 Miller frequently brought the family together for boating and
14 skiing excursions, and he also enjoyed tennis, which he regularly
15 played with a group of close friends; and

16 WHEREAS, With a record of achievement that distinguishes him
17 as a business leader of great talent and wide-ranging abilities,
18 Bill Miller made a significant contribution to the economic
19 prosperity of the Lone Star State, and his visionary endeavors
20 contributed to Houston's growth over the past half-century; now,
21 therefore, be it

22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
23 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of William James Miller
24 and extend sincere sympathy to the members of his family: to his
25 wife, Mary Catherine Miller; to his children, William Farrington
26 Miller, Catherine Michelle Miller Shedd and her husband, Clifford
27 Ernest Shedd III, James Giddings Miller and his wife, Amy Henderson
