

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, March 2 marks the anniversary of that historic day
2 in 1836 when residents of Texas officially declared their
3 independence from Mexico, thereby giving birth to the independent
4 republic that would stand on its own for more than nine years before
5 becoming the 28th state of the Union; and

6 WHEREAS, The proud Texans who issued the call for
7 independence were members of the Convention of 1836 that met at
8 Washington-on-the-Brazos on March 1 of that fateful year; as they
9 gathered, the valiant defenders of the Alamo were facing down the
10 troops of Mexican ruler Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna, and the Texas
11 revolutionaries had reached a crucial point in their campaign for
12 greater political freedom; and

13 WHEREAS, Stating the views of the revolutionaries in no
14 uncertain terms, the Texas Declaration of Independence listed their
15 grievances against the Mexican government and announced their bold
16 conclusion: "*that the people of Texas do now constitute a free,
17 Sovereign, and independent republic, and are fully invested with
18 all the rights and attributes which properly belong to independent
19 nations*"; and

20 WHEREAS, Winning that independence on the battlefield would
21 take another six weeks and the lives of many brave Texans, but the
22 59 delegates who put their names to the Texas Declaration of
23 Independence had carried forth the vision of liberty, independence,
24 and just government that enlightens the Lone Star State to this very

1 day; now, therefore, be it

2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
3 Legislature hereby commemorate Texas Independence Day on March 2,
4 2007, and pay tribute to the immense contributions of those
5 individuals who helped found the nation and state of Texas.
