1 WHEREAS, The Texas House of Representatives joins the
2 citizens of Kaufman County in the celebration of Kaufman County Day
3 at the State Capitol on March 5, 2007; and

4 WHEREAS, King's Fort was established by William P. King and
5 40 pioneers in 1840; Kaufman County was created in 1848, and three
6 years later King's Fort was selected as its county seat and renamed
7 Kaufman, in honor of David Spangler Kaufman, a member of the Texas
8 Legislature and the United States Congress; and

9 WHEREAS, Kaufman County is now one of the top 10
10 fastest-growing counties in the State of Texas; and

11 WHEREAS, Kaufman County has several of the top rated public
12 independent school districts in North Texas; and

13 WHEREAS, Kaufman County is home to three higher education
14 facilities, Southwestern Christian College, Trinity Valley
15 Community College, and Trinity Valley Nursing College, as well as
16 historical and cultural attractions such as the British Flying
17 Training School Museum, the Kaufman County Poor Farm, and the
18 Terrell Heritage Museum; and

19 WHEREAS, *Progressive Farmers Magazine* recently named Kaufman
20 County as one of the top 10 counties to live in the Southwestern
21 United States; and

22 WHEREAS, Kaufman County has long been an outstanding place in
23 which to establish a business, live, work, and raise a family; it is
