3 Mabel Meshach White of Dallas, who passed away on February 24, 2007;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, A native of the Lone Star State, Mrs. White was born
6 on September 1, 1914, in Smithville; in 1936, she married William
7 White, and together they established a successful real estate
8 business; and

9 WHEREAS, Mrs. White was a vital and valued member of her
10 community, serving as president of the board of directors for
11 Holmes Sweet, Inc., second vice president of the board of directors
12 for the Dallas Civic Garden Center, and board member of the African
13 American Museum; the first African American chairwoman of the board
14 of directors for the American Cancer Society, she further shared
15 her time with the YWCA, National Council of Negro Women, Inc.,
16 Church Women United, and Zeta Amicae; and

17 WHEREAS, Also a member of the Dallas Black Chamber of
18 Commerce and Dallas Chamber of Commerce, she participated in the
19 National Association of Real Estate Brokers and the National
20 Association of Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Inc.; and

21 WHEREAS, For more than six decades, Mrs. White attended Good
22 Street Baptist Church, and she served her congregation as president
23 of the missionary society, vice president of the Good Street
24 Baptist Church Federal Credit Union, and board member of the Good

1 Haven Apartment Complex; and

2 WHEREAS, Mrs. White was awarded a host of accolades for her
3 contributions to her community; named Woman of the Year by Zeta Phi
4 Beta Sorority, Inc., she also earned the Christian Service Award,
5 Sojourner Truth Award, and Trailblazer, Ombudswoman, and Charter
6 Member Awards from the South Dallas Business and Professional
7 Women's Club, Inc.; and

8 WHEREAS, Those fortunate enough to have known Mabel White
9 will remember a dynamic woman whose faith and dedication to others
10 made a positive difference in the lives of countless individuals;
11 now, therefore, be it

12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
13 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Mabel Meshach White
14 and extend deepest sympathy to all those who mourn the passing of
