RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Polycystic kidney disease is the most prevalent life-threatening genetic disease in the United States, with a devastating impact on people regardless of gender, age, race, geographic location, or income; 600,000 people nationwide have the

5 genetic predisposition for the disease; and

WHEREAS, One of the four leading causes of kidney failure in the United States, PKD also damages the cardiovascular, endocrine, hepatic, and gastrointestinal systems; the average PKD patient reaches kidney failure by the age of 53, requiring dialysis or a transplant; and

WHEREAS, Those who carry the PKD gene live every day with the potential of a life-threatening disease; people with chronic ailments like PKD are predisposed to depression at a rate seven times the national average, and fear of the disease and limited public awareness may even cause patients to live in denial and forego proper health management; moreover, the stress of the disease extends beyond the patient, as spouses, parents, children, and other loved ones shoulder an increased physical, emotional, and financial burden; and

WHEREAS, PKD is also causing a severe strain on the national health care system; dialysis, kidney transplantation, and immunosuppressant drugs are among the fastest-growing expenditures for Medicare, at an annual cost of \$2 billion; and

24 WHEREAS, Improvements in diagnostic technology and in

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- 1 scientific knowledge are offering hope; the three primary genes
- 2 responsible for PKD and their three primary protein products have
- 3 been discovered, and multiple clinical trials have led to a deeper
- 4 understanding of the disease; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Further technological innovation, continued
- 6 scientific research through the National Institute of Health, and
- 7 collaborative public-private partnerships can generate therapies
- 8 for PKD and save billions in tax dollars under Medicare, Medicaid,
- 9 and other programs and can make available several thousand openings
- 10 on the transplant waiting list; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Nationwide, thousands of volunteers are dedicated
- 12 to expanding essential research and fostering public awareness of
- 13 PKD; their selfless efforts are directed at educating PKD patients
- 14 and their families in order to improve treatment and care, provide
- moral support, and encourage people to sign up as organ donors; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Increasing public awareness of PKD is essential to
- 17 helping to lessen the terrible human and financial toll of this
- 18 disease and to find a cure, and participating in National
- 19 Polycystic Kidney Disease Awareness Week is one way to support this
- 20 effort; now, therefore, be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
- 22 Legislature hereby recognize September 9-15, 2007, as National
- 23 Polycystic Kidney Disease Awareness Week, and encourage all Texans
- 24 to support research and public education concerning this disease.
