1 WHEREAS, Retired U.S. Army Lieutenant General Pete Taylor 2 received the 2007 Book of Golden Deeds Award from the Exchange Club 3 of Killeen in recognition of his many years of exemplary community 4 leadership; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Tennessee, Pete Taylor holds а bachelor's degree from Middle Tennessee State University, as well 6 as a master's degree from Kansas State University, and is a graduate 7 of the U.S. Army War College and the U.S. Army Command and General 8 Staff College; he began his distinguished military career in 1960 9 and subsequently served two tours of duty in Vietnam; he steadily 10 rose through the ranks to become Commander General of III Corps at 11 12 Fort Hood, all the while shaping the lives of many military leaders with his sound advice and astute judgment; and 13

14 WHEREAS, Since retiring in 1993, General Taylor has been called on for his military expertise by Governor George W. Bush, who 15 appointed him to the Texas Strategic Military Planning Commission, 16 which he chaired for several years, and by U.S. Representative 17 18 Nancy Pelosi, who appointed him as commissioner to the Overseas Basing Commission; in addition, he was asked by Central Texas 19 mayors to lead the Heart of Texas Defense Alliance, a group that 20 21 advocates for the sustainability of Fort Hood and other defense 22 industries in the area; and

23 WHEREAS, General Taylor has long supported the Killeen 24 community through his involvement in such noteworthy organizations

as the United Way, the Rotary Club, the Greater Killeen Chamber of 1 2 Commerce, the Boy Scouts of America, the Killeen Food Center, and 3 the American Cancer Society; he served for more than five years on the Killeen Independent School District Board of Trustees and, as a 4 5 member of the Central Texas University Task Force, was instrumental 6 in establishing the Killeen campus of Tarleton State University; 7 moreover, he served as vice chair of the Heights State Bank board 8 for nearly a decade; and

WHEREAS, significant 9 One of General Taylor's most 10 accomplishments is cofounding the Military Child Education Coalition, a national organization that has helped countless 11 military families address the challenges of frequent school 12 transitions faced by their children, and he remains active with 13 14 MCEC as a member of the board of directors; and

WHEREAS, The recipient of numerous honors, including the Frank W. Mayborn Humanitarian Award, General Taylor enjoyed many happy years with his wife, the late Mary Jane Taylor, with whom he raised three children, Kay, Scott, and Curtis, and welcomed six grandchildren; and

20 WHEREAS, The generosity, dedication, and tireless efforts of 21 Lieutenant General Pete Taylor have contributed vitally to the city 22 of Killeen, the Lone Star State, and this nation, and he truly 23 merits the respect and gratitude of his fellow citizens; now, 24 therefore, be it
